WILL THERE BE A SOUND IN SPACE IF NO ONE IS THERE TO HEAR IT?

When I congratulated Jim B. on his accomplishments he used a homey cockney phrase to answer; "**'e dun 'is best.**"

Jim told me his most life-defining experience was growing up in England during World War II. He was seven years old, and knowing how quickly his life could end made him want to get the most out of it. However, what changed his direction was falling just short of earning his bachelor's degree. That rerouted him to work for a company that provided four years of schooling in aeronautical engineering. He became involved in a project that was in danger of being canceled, so he submitted an application to NASA and was accepted to work on the Apollo Project.

He was assigned to work as an acoustician. He described a huge reverberation chamber where a small section of the Apollo was placed so the effect of various noises could be studied. Filling the chamber with 'white noise' (which is similar to radio static) could cause the reverberation from a sound to remain constant, enabling him to determine how the sensitive instruments in a spacecraft might react to high noise levels. He later worked on giant aircraft engines.

It's easy to see why this was the high point of Jim's career. But he also enjoyed being able to enter a church and clap his hands so he could recommend an acoustical treatment that would control the excess reverb. Every project presented different problems and he admits to missing the challenge nowadays.

Jim is also a photographer and builds miniature houses for the fun of it. He has read for the blind on the radio and aided research into allergies by giving himself shots to document his reaction. He was active in amateur theatre for twenty-five years, and if you want to hear something really bizarre, ask him about the car rallies of his reckless youth.

This will give you an idea of how Jim B. managed to get the most out of life. But he confides that the smartest thing he ever did was to marry Isobel almost sixty-three years ago.

I'm secretly hoping he will study the hearing needs at Alder Bay so our gettogethers will be more enjoyable for all.
