Septemberfest



The confusing thing about the German celebration of Oktoberfest is that it begins in September! Five o'clock in the morning in Germany on September 16, to be exact. While many consider Oktoberfest to be a 16-daylong beer festival, its roots

have nothing to do with beer. The first Oktoberfest was held in Bavaria on October 12, 1810, on the occasion of the marriage of Crown Prince Ludwig to Princess Therese von Sachsen-Hildburghausen. It was so much fun that Oktoberfest became an annual celebration, yet it wasn't until 1818 that beer halls were added to the live music and horse racing. Then, in order to extend the celebration and take advantage of better weather, Oktoberfest was moved to September.
