

Frequently Asked Questions about Overactive Bladder

What is Overactive Bladder? Overactive Bladder isn't a disease. Name of a group of urinary symptoms. The most common symptom of OAB is a sudden urge to urinate that can't control. Some people will leak urine when they feel this urge. Having to urinate many times during the day and night is another symptom OAB.

How common is OAB?

OAB is common. It affects millions of Americans. As many as 30 percent of men and 40 percent of women in the United States live with OAB symptoms.

Who is at rick for OAB?

As you grow older, you're at higher rick for OAB. But no matter what your age, there are treatments that can help. Both men and women are at risk for OAB. Women who have gone through menopause ("change of life") have a higher than normal rick. Men who have had prostate problems also seem to have an increased rick for OAB. People with diseases that affect the brain or nervous system, such as stroke and multiple sclerosis (MS), are at high rick for OAB.
