Maintenance Corner It's Annual Spring Inspection Time!



As we start April, we are getting ready for our annual spring inspection of units. Please help us by doing the following:

- 1. Availability: Please make sure to be available on your inspection day. A notice will be affixed to your front door 48 hours prior to your inspection.
- Pets: Please make sure all dogs and cats are put on a leash, or caged, to avoid our maintenance staff from being bit, or your animal running out of the home during inspection.
- 3. <u>Utility Closet:</u> Please make sure that your utility closet doors are not blocked, and you do not have anything stored in this closet. It is a safety hazard. We use this inspection time to change the filter.

- 4. <u>Carports:</u> Please make sure that your carport is clean. This is not a storage area. Please use your storage closets for storage. You must be able to pull your vehicle into your carport.
- 5. <u>Doorways:</u> Please make sure that all doorways are clear of items. All doorways must be able to be accessed in case of an emergency.
- 6. Work Orders: Please do not have a list of work orders for the maintenance staff while they are doing their inspections. You must call in all work orders so they can be properly written up. No work orders will be taken during your inspection.

What we will be looking for:

- 1. Utility closet clear
- 2. Carport clear
- 3. Doorways clear
- 4. Housekeeping
- 5. All appliances work properly
- Smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are working properly
- 7. Carpet / vinyl wear

Ingredients

2 1/2 cups sifted cake flour

1 1/3 cups sugar

1 tablespoon baking powder

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 cup vegetable oil

5 large eggs, separated

3/4 cup, fresh orange juice

3 tablespoons orange zest

1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar

2 teaspoon cream of tartar

Directions

Step 1—Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine first 4 ingredients in a bowl of a electric stand mixer. Make a well in the center of the flour mixture; add oil, egg yolks, and orange juice. Beat at medium-high speed for 3-4 minutes or until smooth. Stir in zest.

Step 2—Beat egg whites and cream of tartar at medium-high speed until stiff peaks form. Gently fold into flour mixture. Spoon batter into 3 greased and floured 9-inch round cake pans.

Step 3– Bake at 350 degrees for 17 to 20 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted into the center comes clean. Cool in pans on wire racks for 10 minutes; remove from pans to wire racks, and cool completely (about an hour).

Step 4– Spread lemon-orange buttercream frosting between layers and on top and sides of cake.

Lemon-Orange Buttercream Frosting

Ingredients

1 cup butter, softened

3 tablespoons orange zest

1 tablespoon lemon zest

1 (32oz) package powdered sugar

3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

5 tablespoons fresh orange juice

1 tablespoon additional fresh orange juice

Directions

Beat butter, orange zest, and lemon zest at medium speed with an electric mixer 1 to 2 minutes or until creamy. Gradually add powdered sugar alternately with lemon juice and 5 tbsp. fresh orange juice; beating at low speed until blended after each addition. Add up to 1 tbsp. additional fresh orange juice until desired consistency is reached.
