



Communication plays a big role in behavior management

Once you have observed the person's behavior, try to find out what might have caused it. Ask yourself questions such as "Why is my loved one upset?" or "What happened in the last few minutes that could have prompted this behavior?" Also, do a basic evaluation to cover all your bases: consider that the person could be cold, hungry. in pain, bored, threatened, sleepy, frightened, etc. Once your assess the root cause of this behavior, you can communicate accordingly.

Offer comfort. Caregivers can provide comfort or reassurance through validation— a technique that allows person to stay in the moment without being proven wrong or brought back to reality. For instance, if an older man becomes upset because he cannot find his mother, an effective response might be: "I know you miss your mother very much, and she loves you too. You were always your mother's pride and joy." This will help the individual feel understood and safe.
