Creative Reality

Creative Reality simply means getting into a person's world, rather than trying to orientate the person to ours. An example of the use of this technique might be having a conversation with a person where they believe the time to be thirty or forty years prior to the actual date. Their recollection of the

event they may be describing can have great clarity and it is important the family, friend and/or caregiver understand the person's belief of the event being a current one. The caregiver needs to respectfully listen without interrupting or correcting the person's disorientation to time, place or person. In doing so the person is allowed to engage in what to them is meaningful conversation that usually brings pleasure in the moment. Using **Creative Reality** means the caregiver needs to understand that each episode or event the person communicates is an opportunity to make the most of that moment for the person by entering into their world, and validating their story with them.

A Note from the Executive Director - Continued

This form of interaction brings to the person a sense of purpose and meaning in what normally could be a fragmented day.

Creative Reality does not impose upon caregivers the ethical dilemma of telling the memory impaired individual lies, which caregivers are often concerned with. It does allow the caregiver to creatively and with sensitivity soothe the often fears and worries the person may refer to in their daily communication with staff. An example might be the person who believes their parent is waiting for them and is showing signs of increasing anxiety of how they will reach that parent. Of course the caregiver knows the parent is long deceased. The caregiver would simply validate the person's feeling and offer the person assistance in solving the dilemma. This doesn't mean the caregiver needs to say "Your parent is home and will be here soon to get you" but the caregiver might say something like this, "Oh dear, I see this really has you worried. I know my parents would be concerned about this to. Why don't I get you something to drink and a snack, and then I will try to make a telephone call to find out some information for you".
