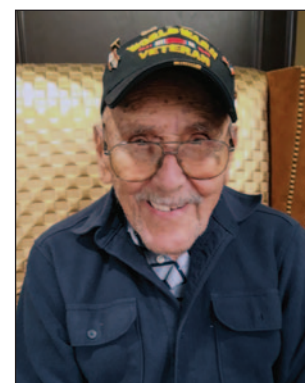

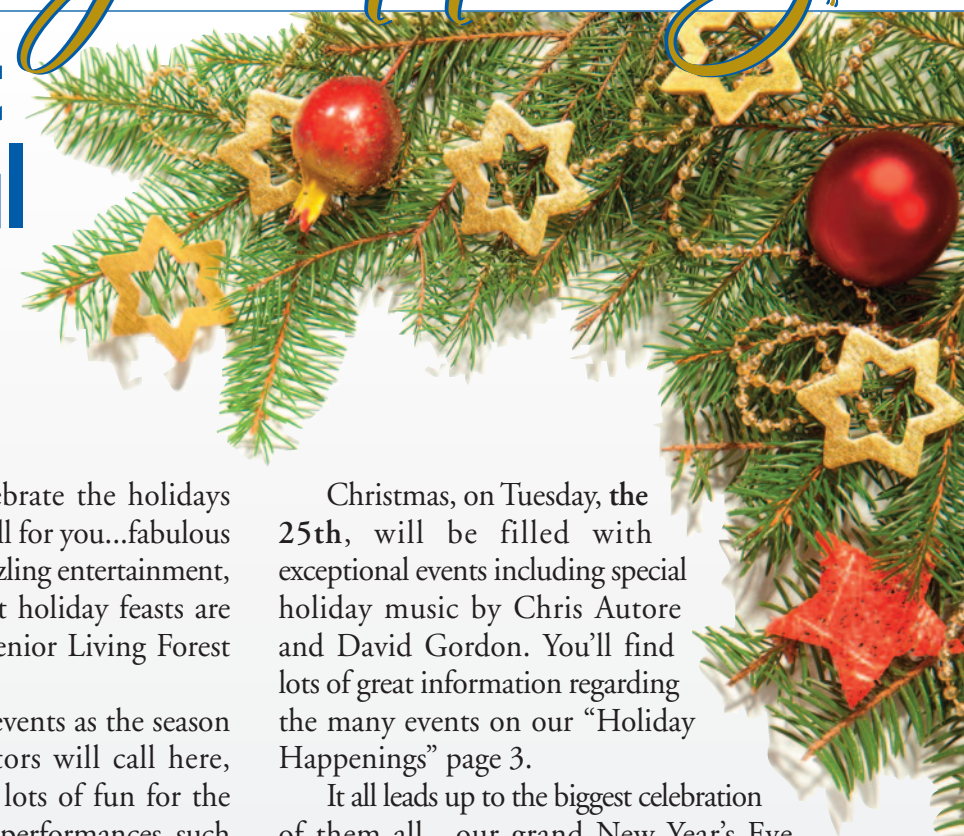

Holocaust Survivor David Mandel



David Mandel is a very unique man. As a survivor of the brutal holocaust in Europe, he has made it his life's mission to educate young students on the truth about this dark part of our history. The so-called "history revisionists" are those who deny that the Holocaust ever occurred at the hands of the Nazi regime during World War II. His mission is to testify and let the truth of the Holocaust be known. There are fewer and fewer survivors alive and, as David was one of the young captives, his sense of obligation is quite formidable.

In 1990, David and a fellow survivor, Mike Vogel, went back to the death camps at Auschwitz, and were filmed for a documentary entitled, "If You Cried, You Died." We are honored to spend time with David on

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR MIND-STIMULATING LECTURES

"What's Your View?" with Liz Reynolds

**Mondays, December 10th, 17th and 31st
11:00 a.m.**

The 2018 midterm elections were historic because voters turned out in record numbers for both parties and both parties made gains. Democrats have gained 39 seats in the US House of Representatives, the most flipped House seats since the wave election following Watergate where the Democrats picked up 49 seats. There are still two House races to call.

The Republicans flipped four Senate seats red in Florida, Indiana, Missouri and North Dakota and the Democrats have flipped two seats blue in Arizona and Nevada. That means that the Republicans have picked up two Senate seats.

In terms of governorships, the Democrats won seven governor's races and the Republicans lost six. The count is now 23 Democratic governors and 27 Republican governors. At the state level, Democrats gained more seats than Republicans in 36 of the 46 states that elected legislators this year and gained control of seven state legislatures. Republicans picked up more seats than Democrats in five states. Three states voted to expand Medicaid coverage and Florida voted to pass Amendment 4, ending the practice of permanent felony disenfranchisement.

The biggest winners in this election were women. A record number of women were elected to the House of Representatives. With eight races yet to be called, 101 women have been elected to the House, 13 women to the Senate and 9 women as governors. 43 women of color were elected to the House, one to the Senate and one will serve as governor. Of the women elected, 105 are Democrats and 18 are Republicans. Two Native American women, one Korean American woman and two Muslim women were elected.

What does it all mean? Since both parties had gains, the current gridlock will probably continue, so fasten your seat belts, it is going to be a bumpy ride! President Trump continues to keep his core base and will most likely do so in the 2020 election. Republicans continue to be strong with older white men and women who may or may not have a college education. Rural areas are strongly Republican.

Suburban, higher educated women left the Trump camp and flipped many red districts blue near the big cities. The base for the Democrats appears to be younger and more diversified with Asian-Americans, Hispanics, African-Americans, Muslim-Americans and higher educated men and women voting for the Democrats. This millennial coalition is partially attributable to the efforts of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas students who led a strong nationwide effort to get young people to vote, up from 20% to 36%.

As of July, 2018, 40% of all voters registered are Democrat, 29% are Republican and 28% are independent (AXIOS Study.) In July, 2016, it was 42% (Democrat) to 42% (Republican) so the Republican Party must do more to shore up its' Republican voter registration and both parties will have to do their best to try to win over the Independents in the 2020 Presidential election. We can only hope that the youthful, female additions to the Congress will help to tone down the hateful rhetoric of our Congress and possibly lead our representatives to more civil discourse.

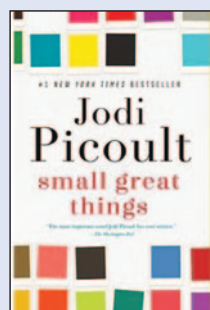
Book Review with Goldie Witrock: *Small Great Things*
