"The purpose of the dedication was to create a special place in our home—Traditions of Hanover—that recognizes the importance of our Veterans and that they have a home to be proud of," said Heimsoth.

Chris Luddeni, dietary director, shared his experiences of military service. Luddeni acknowledged his service was a short time in comparison to other Veterans; however, it helped shape him into the man he is today.

"It was an honor to share my story with the residents," said Luddeni.

In closing, some scouts shared poems and readings regarding the Veterans, including one who played the taps on his trumpet. After the rendition, there wasn't a dry eye in the room. Refreshments of cookies and cider were provided after the ceremony and the scouts stayed to enjoy some social time with the residents.
