

## Honoring Mae Jemison, America's first black female astronaut

Meet Mae Jemison, America's first black female astronaut. Jemison's passion for science emerged at an early age, and spans well beyond the field of astronomy. She was born in 1956 in Alabama, but was raised in Chicago, IL, where, as a small child, she was first introduced to several scientific areas of study, including anthropology, astronomy and archaeology. She jumped into her studies headfirst, and emerged with an undergraduate degree from Stanford University in 1977 and a medical degree from Cornell University in 1981.

Prior to making her debut in space as a mission specialist aboard the Endeavour in 1992, Jemison focused on international medicine, working as a general practitioner and a medical officer in the Peace Corps. Her research projects led to collaboration with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the National Institute of Health, among others.

Jemison was accepted into the NASA program in 1987, a feat that had never before been accomplished by a black female. Following her stint at NASA, Jemison has continued to dedicate herself to science and technology through teaching, creating science-centered programs for high-schoolers and much more. She also heads up the 100-Year Starship program, which aims to enable human travel outside the solar system over the next century. Mae Jemison not only breaks barriers, but also continues to test them.

#### **GROUNDHOG DAY**

A holiday that brings people from all parts of the world to western Pennsylvania, for the weather prediction of Punxsutawney Phil.

Early European Christians would take their candles to the church to have them blessed for the protection of their homes during the remaining winter.

An old English folk song highlights the transition to weather prediction.

'If Candlemas be fair and bright, Come, winter, have another flight; If Candlemas brings clouds and rain, Go winter, and come not again.'

When this belief reached Germany, an animal was introduced to the folk lore. If the hedgehog saw his shadow on Candlemas Day, there would be a Second Winter (6 more weeks of bad weather). In the U.S., tradition replaced the hedgehog with the groundhog.

In 1886, Groundhog Day appeared in the Punxsutawney, PA, newspaper, the next year the first trek was made to Gobbler's Knob, and the participation has steadily increased.

Groundhog Day remains a day to take everything a little less seriously, and break up the winter monotony... at least for a while!






## February: It's Not Just the Occasional Leap Year

February may be the shortest month of the year, but it's packed with interesting and unusual characteristics. Here are a few to ponder as you shiver:

- Once every six years and twice every 11 years it has four full seven-day weeks.
- February starts on the same day of the week as March and November (shifting to August in leap years).
- February ends on the same day of the week as October.
- In leap years, February ends on the same weekday it begins.
- February is the only month that can pass without a full moon.



Feb. 18 marks the annual observance of Presidents Day. The official federal holiday, known as Washington's Birthday, occurs on the third Monday of February in honor of the first president's Feb. 22 birthday. Regardless of the celebration's official title, a countless number of institutions take this opportunity to celebrate the myriad accomplishments of not only George Washington, but also the other 44 commanders-in-chief.

America's former leaders had some pretty interesting paths to presidency, with no shortage of job opportunities in other fields. Here are a few facts you might find surprising:

- Ninth President William Henry Harrison was the only president to study medicine in college. Rather than becoming a doctor, however, he opted for a military career.
- Seventeenth President Andrew Johnson was a skilled tailor, whose training began at age 10.
- Harry S. Truman tested his hand as a haberdasher prior

to becoming the 33rd president, running a business that sold men's goods. Economic hardship led to the store's failure in the early 1920s.

- Former President Jimmy Carter, the 39th commanderin-chief, worked in the family peanut-farming business in Georgia. Despite being ultimately quite successful, the business faced numerous financial and agricultural obstacles, leading Carter to become the only president to reside in subsidized housing prior to taking office.
- James A. Garfield, the 20th president, was simultaneously
  a teacher and student at the Western Reserve Eclectic
  Institute in Ohio. His dedication to learning led to
  regular preaching at area churches.
