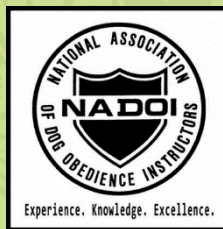




Continuing Education Credits

- ❖ Absorbent compresses - assorted sizes
- ❖ Adhesive tape
- ❖ Antibiotic ointment
- ❖ Blanket
- ❖ Cold compress
- ❖ Pet first aid manual
- ❖ Epsom salts
- ❖ Gloves, disposable
- ❖ Karo syrup
- ❖ Grooming clippers
- ❖ Hydrogen peroxide 3%
- ❖ List of emergency phone numbers (veterinarian, after-hours vet hospital, ASPCA poison control hotline, etc)
- ❖ Muzzle
- ❖ Nail clippers
- ❖ Needle-nose pliers
- ❖ Nylon leash
- ❖ Petroleum jelly
- ❖ Penlight
- ❖ Rectal thermometer, digital
- ❖ Roll cohesive wrap (vet wrap)
- ❖ Roll gauze
- ❖ Rubbing alcohol
- ❖ Scissors
- ❖ Sterile gauze pads, non-adherent
- ❖ Sterile, water based lubricant
- ❖ Syringe
- ❖ Sterile eye lubricant

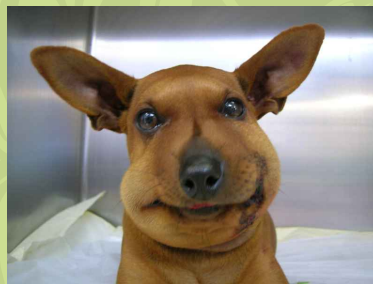

Q

Who should take this course?

A
