I don't think I've ever seen John in a bad mood.

Space precludes me from going on much longer, but it is with the above in mind that I wanted to take this opportunity to use to say 'Thank You' to John. He is entering a well-earned and overdue retirement at the end of this month, and the truth is he is not likely to be replaced or forgotten by those of us fortunate enough to consider him our friend.
