#### FEATURED RESIDENT: MARY ANNE K.

Mary Anne has a son, daughter-in-law, four grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren. She is the eldest of three sisters and four brothers. She muses, "It was fun growing up in a big family, there's always something to talk about." Born on an elevator in Eugene, Oregon, her father would say, "You were anxious to get here!"



She had a lot to do! Throughout the years she had a wide array of jobs including crab picker, truck driver, choker setter, floral designer, model, and certified nursing assistant. However, it was her last job that was her favorite and the most proud of - tutoring and teaching children to read. Her inspiration to teach struggling readers was her son, who had hearing difficulties. It was the most gratifying because she found that her kids were absolutely unique when given their own growing space. While she taught them, they also taught her in return.

At 24, and responsible for a young son, she was in a devastating car accident by Loon Lake and was taken to a hospital in Coos Bay, Oregon. Doctors from San Francisco and Seattle came to assist in surgeries and reconstruction of her body and face. During the healing process she regained her individual senses at different times. At a clinic, where she was recovering, she'd pass a room that had bouquets and bouquets of fresh flowers. She would always wave and call out a greeting as she went by but one day was different; she could smell roses! She came into her friend's room and buried her face into a large bouquet - laughing and inhaling the fragrance of yellow roses in absolute wonderment! From that day on, as a kind gesture, her friend and friend's husband sent her a single rose to her hospital room every day. And each time she regained a sense, she exclaimed, "How much better can it get!"

She realizes it's this accident that literally reshaped her physically and buoyed her spiritually. It became the most fortunate adventure of her life, making her a more conscientious and empathetic person. She adds that she was fortunate to have a large, supportive family during this life changing experience. Upon reflecting on the accident, life experiences, and family, she says, "I can't imagine a better life."

Mary Anne moved to Bayberry in February and we're excited to be part of her life! - by Janiece Crowe

#### IMPORTANCE OF A POSITIVE ENVIRONMENT FOR OUR RESIDENTS

Alzheimer's disease and dementia can change how elders view their environment. Places and

people they once knew may become unfamiliar and this can lead to stress, isolation and behaviors.

It helps elders with Alzheimer's disease and dementia to live in a place that has a consistent daily routine and is comfortable to them. Their surroundings should be familiar and should feel like home. Some items to help elders feel at home could be:

Furnishings from home such as their recliner or bed and perhaps some decorations or wall hangings.

Make their room easy to navigate, avoid any tripping hazards.

Hang photos of family or of themselves in their room.

Smaller dining areas like ours are helpful as well because it helps to cut down distractions and encourages conversation.

The size of our Memory Care community is ideal to make our residents feel safe, secure and at home. Feel free to stop by any time for a visit.
