
Resident of the Month: Dean Ross

April in History

April 30, 1789 – George Washington became the first U.S. President as he was administered the oath of office on the balcony of Federal Hall at the corner of Wall and Broad Streets in New York City.

April 14, 1828 — The first dictionary of American-style English was published by Noah Webster as the American Dictionary of the English Language.

April 22, 1864 — "In God We Trust" was included on all newly minted U.S. coins by an Act of Congress.

April 14, 1865 — President Abraham Lincoln was shot and mortally wounded while watching a performance of "Our American Cousin" at Ford's Theater in Washington. He was taken to a nearby house and died the following morning at 7:22 a.m.

April 15, 1912 — In the icy waters off Newfoundland, the luxury liner Titanic with 2,224 persons on board sank at 2:27 a.m., after striking an iceberg just before midnight. Over 1,500 persons drowned while 700 were rescued by the liner Carpathia, which arrived about two hours after Titanic went down.

April 6, 1917 — Following a vote by Congress approving a declaration of war, the U.S. entered World War I in Europe.

April 12, 1945 — President Franklin D. Roosevelt died suddenly at Warm Springs, Georgia, after suffering a cerebral hemorrhage.

April 30, 1967 – Boxer Muhammad Ali was stripped of his world heavyweight boxing championship after refusing to be inducted into the American military. He had claimed religious exemption.

April 4, 1968 – Civil Rights leader Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King was shot and killed by a sniper in Memphis, Tennessee.

April 11, 1970 – Apollo 13 was launched from Cape Kennedy at 2:13 p.m. 56 hours into the flight, an oxygen tank exploded in the service module. Astronaut John L. Swigert saw a warning light that accompanied the bang and said, "Houston, we've had a problem here." Swigert, James A. Lovell and Fred W. Haise then transferred into the lunar module, using it as a "lifeboat" and began a perilous return trip to Earth, splashing down safely on April 17th.

April 19, 1995 – At 9:02 a.m., a massive car-bomb explosion destroyed the entire side of a nine story federal building in Oklahoma City, killing 168 persons, including 19 children inside a day care center. A decorated Gulf War veteran was later convicted for the attack.

April 20, 1999 – The deadliest school shooting in U.S. history occurred in Littleton, Colorado, as two students armed with guns and explosives stormed into Columbine High School at lunch time. They killed 12 classmates and a teacher, and wounded more than 20 other persons before killing themselves.

A sure sign of spring is the beautiful blossoming of many trees. Here are a few varieties that put on a seasonal show:

Dogwood — Native to North America, the dogwood is famous for its stunning springtime display of white or pink blooms, making it a popular landscaping tree since America's earliest days. Both George Washington and Thomas Jefferson had dogwoods planted at their estates.

Japanese flowering cherry – This tree is the star of the National Cherry Blossom Festival in Washington, D.C., as well as other spring celebrations around the world. Its branches display delicate pink-white flowers that bloom for just a short time early in the season.

Magnolia — Prized for their large, fragrant flowers in shades of white, pink, red, purple and yellow, magnolias are often associated with the South, but varieties are grown in every region.

Eastern redbud – Dainty clusters of magenta blooms attract butterflies and birds to the redbud, which grows primarily in the eastern half of the U.S.


