### Honduras Project

Our Honduras Project is off to a GREAT start! We have had a wonderful group of dedicated residents coming out Tuesday mornings, and transforming pillowcases into drawstring bags. We have also had residents successfully remove labels off pill bottles. We will continue to take pillowcase donations and empty pill bottles until the beginning of June. At that point, we'll wrap up what we are working on so that we can give the drawstring bags and pill bottles to Medical Ministry International, to take with them over to Honduras. The pill bottles will be reused for carrying medications in place of plastic bags. The drawstring bags will be used for carrying belongings home, and then children who are able to attend school will use the bags to carry their belongings to school.

Thank you to everyone who has donated pillowcases and pill bottles! This project would not have been possible without your donations! And a huge thank you to ALL of our residents who participated in the transformation of the pillowcases. Because of you, not only does a pillowcase get a second life, but we have made someone else's life a little easier. So, thank you!
