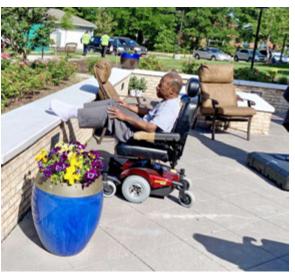
Here are some summer tips to always remember:
