This virtual tour highlights numerous art treasures including a seascape by Rembrandt, an interior by Vermeer, oils by Raphael and Titian as well as masterpieces by John Singer Sargent. The Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum is an art museum in Boston, Massachusetts, which houses significant examples of European, Asian, and American art. Its collection includes paintings, sculpture, tapestries, and decorative arts.



A Ride on the Tucson Streetcar

Riding the Streetcar is a great way to see downtown Tucson and the University of Arizona Campus, and that's what we did. After the ride on the Streetcar we enjoyed a delicious lunch at the Corner Bakery.

Streetcars are not a new idea in Tucson. Since 1897, Tucson has used streetcars to move people through the business and residential areas near downtown and the University of Arizona.

While several attempts to create a streetcar line had been made beginning in the 1880s, it wasn't until the University of Arizona was established that lines were implemented for both downtown and the university. In 1897, the first horse/mule-drawn streetcar was introduced in Tucson. While electric lines were common by this time, inadequate power supply and higher cost convinced the Tucson Street Railway Company to use horse/mule-drawn cars. Routes expanded through town and eventually 10 cars were in use by 1906. Bought by Tucson Rapid Transit Company, electric streetcars were installed and in 1906 a ceremonial procession retiring the horse/mule drawn streetcars occurred on June 1st. The new electric streetcars ran until December 31, 1930 when they were replaced by buses. A fundraising campaign tied to the University of Arizona Centennial celebration brought back the streetcar and it was operated by Old Pueblo Trolley from 1993 to 2011 when it closed for the construction of the modern streetcar. The Sun Link Tucson Streetcar is the continuation of 100 years of streetcar service in Tucson.

The Gallery in the Sun:

What started as a small construction project in the 1950s developed into a 10-acre National Historic District designed and built by DeGrazia. Visitors can view not only the art hung in the gallery, but the colorful grounds and sculptures surrounding the property.

When the town of Tucson grew near to his first studio on Campbell Avenue and Prince Road, DeGrazia and his wife Marion, a sculptor from Upstate New York, bought the isolated foothills property in the early 1950s to escape the encroachment.

A true Renaissance man, Ettore "Ted" DeGrazia experimented with oil paintings, sculptures, ceramics and water colors. Today, DeGrazia is known around the world for capturing the spirit of the Southwest and its people.

"The gallery was designed by me. I wanted to have the feeling of the Southwest. I wanted to build it so that my paintings would feel good inside." — Ettore "Ted" DeGrazia

Fun Facts About the 4th of July:

- 1. Congress made Independence Day an official unpaid holiday for federal employees in 1870. In 1938, Congress changed Independence Day to a paid federal holiday.
- 2. Only John Hancock actually signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. All the others signed later.
- 3. The Declaration of Independence was signed by 56 men from 13 colonies.
- 4. The average age of the signers of the Declaration of Independence was 45. The youngest was Thomas Lynch, Jr. (27) of South Carolina. The oldest delegate was Benjamin Franklin (70) of Pennsylvania. The lead author of the Declaration, Thomas Jefferson, was 33.
- 5. The only two signers of the Declaration of Independence who later served as President of the United States were John Adams and Thomas Jefferson.
- 6. The stars on the original American flag were in a circle so all the Colonies would appear equal.
- 7. The first Independence Day celebration took place in Philadelphia on July 8, 1776. This was also the day that the Declaration of Independence was first read in public after people were summoned by the ringing of the Liberty Bell.
- 8. The White House held its first 4th of July party in 1801.
- 9. President John Adams, Thomas Jefferson and James Monroe all died on the 4th. Adams and Jefferson (both signed the Declaration) died on the same day within hours of each other in 1826.
- 10. Benjamin Franklin proposed the turkey as the national bird but was overruled by John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, who recommended the bald eagle.
- 11. Every 4th of July the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is tapped (not actually rung) 13 times in honor of the original 13 colonies.
