

Resident Spotlight: Lorraine Brown

"My Boys"

My name is Lorraine Gustafson Brown. I moved into Glenmoore in 2014 after selling my home in Portland. My mother was born and lived on a homestead in Cottage Grove, Oregon, and my father was born in Portland.

The most vivid memory I have of growing up is having my tonsils removed by Dr. Edgar Anderson on my

Grandmother's kitchen table, when I was nine years old! Can you imagine that?

While I was in high school, I was the drum majorette for our marching band and loved stepping out on parade. I graduated from La Grande High School and met my husband-to-be, Jerry, in 1948 at an ice rink here in Portland. Jerry and I spent hours together holding hands while ice skating and roller skating at the old wooden rink.

After high school, I was trained as a welder in the Portland shipyards and earned \$1.25 an hour. That wage was not bad for a girl right out of school, but then there was a war going on and we needed "all hands on deck" in the shipyards.

Jerry and I were married in 1950 and had a fairly large family: three sons, Ken, David and Dennis, and one daughter, Gerry. Our family expanded when we heard about children being sent to Portland to attend the Tucker Maxon School for the Deaf on Holgate Street, and who had no place to live. Our family volunteered to host a student, who would live with us for the school year. Our family never did anything special to accommodate our students who were deaf. I told them I was going to treat them exactly as I did my own children, and it worked out beautifully!

Our first student was Stevie, who was totally deaf but sharp as a whip. My fondest memory of Stevie was his beautiful curly, thick, black hair. My own boys got their very straight, thin, blonde hair cut by me in the garage, in a very short crewcut. Stevie said he wanted me to cut off his beautiful thick hair the same way I cut my sons' hair. I was able to talk Stevie out of the crew cut idea until the end of December, when I finally gave him his crewcut. This was just before he was supposed to go home to visit with his family for the holidays in California. I was afraid his family was going to hate the haircut and think that I was treating him badly. As he stepped off of the airplane, his family rushed up to meet him, wanting to know where he got his "cool" hair cut. Boy, was I relieved!

Our second student with a disability was Ronnie, who was partially deaf and blind. He had a very sad back story. His mother had contracted measles while she was pregnant, and as a result, Ronnie was born partially deaf and blind. We treated him exactly the same way we treated Stevie, as a member of our family. We took him hiking, camping, to the beach, and on other outings with my children. They played Pollyanna, a board game similar to Parcheesi, for hours in the playroom, and spent afternoons on the baseball diamond together. Ronnie lived with us for three years and we learned a great deal from his family. His father was a furrier and gave me a mink stole as a gift one year. He reconditioned another coat for me that had dried out and become too stiff to wear.

Our next guest child, Chris, came to us through the Portland foster care program and was ten years old. He had been beaten by his father and was both physically and emotionally scarred. Chris stayed with us for only six months. The trust between him and my family was broken when he started to steal items from my son's room. Chris left us shortly after, but years later made an unexpected visit. He was participating in an organized walk-a-thon and recognized our house in his old neighborhood. He left the walk-a-thon group, and came over to our house to say hello to our family. He thanked us for our support and told us he was doing well.

Most of our extended family continued to thrive and stayed in touch with us long after they became independent. My life as a mother, and the life of my family, were greatly enriched by sharing with "my boys" from both the school for the deaf and the foster care program in Portland. We loved these children as our own, and will always be grateful for the time we spent together.
