Pretty sound philosophy, isn't it?


Meet Your Neighbors in Aston Gardens

Oct. 10 Surprise, surprise!!!! Pancakes again today!!! Overcast, dull day. The play was close most of the way.



Pioneer Museum, better known
as "Roberts Ranch."

We started our tour in the museum, an old converted church building that had been moved to the Roberts Ranch site to serve as a museum, and that contains informational exhibits on life in the Immokalee area in the 1900s. We then went over to the Roberts Ranch House itself, that housed Mr. and Mrs. Roberts and their 9 children. We toured the inside of the house. Surrounding the relatively small main house were a number of outbuildings such as a kitchen, and a smoke house, and a bunk house for the cowboys and horse stalls. (In early times, it was customary to put the kitchen in an outbuilding in case the kitchen caught fire; in that case, the kitchen fire wouldn't burn down the house.)

After our visit to Roberts
Ranch, we drove about a mile
away to Lozano's Mexican
Restaurant for a delicious
luncheon meal of tacos,
burritos, fajitas, and other
Mexican foods. Then, we
returned home to Aston
