

### Resident Spotlight

Rosa Fidalgo was born in Portugal and moved to Canada in 1967 with her five-month-old baby girl (Roberta) and almost fiveyear-old son (Joe Jr.).

When a company from Stratford, Ontario went to Portugal to recruit new factory workers, Rosa's husband Joe was the only one offered a job because he could speak English. He had learned English while working on the ships that travelled between Portugal and Canada.

Over the next five years, Rosa had another daughter (Eneida) and son (Tony).

Rosa lived in Stratford until 1980 and then moved to Mississauga where Joe could start a new job as a plant manager. (He had been going to night school for years to be able to progress in his career.)

Following many successful work years, and in anticipation of a long and healthy retirement, they built their dream home in Cambridge where they lived for many years until Joe's passing. Rosa and Joe were married almost 50 years and enjoyed travelling together to places such as Florida, Dominican Republic and Cuba.

In their earlier years, Rosa and Joe would take their four children on road trips to the beach in the summertime, including Grand Bend, Godrich, Pinery and St. Mary's. She loved to cook a big pot of rice, wrap it up in blankets and put it in a box. The children would always enjoy a



hot picnic lunch while other kids ate hot dogs.

Rosa was a stay-at-home mom for many years raising her four children. She did everything. There was always a home-cooked meal for the family, the house was clean, and lunches were packed. She grew and maintained a vegetable garden that took up most of their backyard. The veggies fed the family all summer and winter. She was quite the gardener too. She had the most beautiful flowers framing her verandas and always put fresh-cut flowers into vases to decorate the dining room table.

Rosa had a few jobs over the years, working in factories while trying to perfect her English. She counted on her children to help around the house with chores including cooking, washing dishes, ironing and cleaning bathrooms. It was a wonderful time when the family bought a new car—a red Malibu Classic (two-door). It was quite lush inside and only had three seat belts for four kids in the backseat.

She always loved to entertain company with her homemade meals and desserts. She has always made the best bean soup (from the garden). Rosa loves all types of food with fish being her favourite. Rosa has always made her family the center of her life, celebrating holidays and birthdays together. She makes the best Easter bread ever! For years, she would crochet with a fine point needle and her family

is lucky enough to have some of these beautiful pieces she made. She took care of her mother after her father passed away by bringing her to Canada to live with family.

Since becoming a widow, she has tried so many new things for the first time including riding on a train, riding a gondola-style boat, painting, having a facial and pedicure.

She is always excited about having her grandchildren around and will put sugar on their strawberries just to make sure they like her strawberries better than their mom's.

She lives each day for her family. She enjoys visiting her daughter in British Columbia, speaking Portuguese with her grandson and spending time with their dog, Rosie. She has been to many wineries, boating, camping and has had dinner at award-winning restaurants.

She loves hanging out with her daughter's family in Moffat, watching the children grow, hanging out on the deck or by the pool, and having barbecue.



She is also a regular visitor to her son's cottage in Wasaga Beach. While in Wasaga, she loves sitting in the sun, visiting with the neighbours (and their dog, too!) and watching the river traffic. She does, on occasion, venture out on the boat for a tour, or down to the beach for a stroll. Everyone enjoys spending time with Rosa. Her openness, sense of humour, sharing stories and memories of Portugal, and telling jokes makes for a very fun evening. There may even be an impromptu dance party when she's around. Rosa's company is much appreciated by her entire family, their friends and extended family.

She has always had a great love for music and dancing; her mind continues to be quite sharp, but her body doesn't let her boogie the way she used to and wants to.

Rosa will always tell it like it is — she really doesn't have a filter and that's what people love about her.

She's authentic and real! One of her favourite sayings is, "piece of cake."

Rosa is a wonderful human being and mother. She is smart, witty, patient, loving, kind and caring.

Rosa has such a passion for life and really enjoys living at the Heritage. She has made some great friends who have helped her find the energy and zest she lost after becoming a widow.
