

# "O Christmas Tree, O Christmas Tree..."

#### The History of This Wonderful Tradition

After we finish up the Thanksgiving leftovers, most of us can't wait to start decorating our homes with Christmas decorations! For most of us, that is the day after Thanksgiving! Out come the boxes from storage, the decorations are laid out and up goes the Christmas tree! We adorn the Christmas tree with lights and ornaments we have collected and cherished over the years. These treasures are carefully arranged on each branch with much love and thought. Now, this magnificently decorated Christmas tree becomes the focal point of our home during the Christmas season.

Where did this custom of bringing a real tree into our living rooms come from? Evidently, during the 16th century, German households started the tradition of decorating a live evergreen tree with fruits and nuts and putting real candles on the branches to be lit. Evergreens were chosen because the branches remain green throughout the season of Advent. When German immigrants settled in Pennsylvania during the 1700s, they brought this wonderful tradition to America. Over time, Americans added the tradition of stringing popcorn and paper decorations to decorate the tree. Evergreens have remained the choice for a Christmas tree because they symbolize growth and everlasting love, meaning the everlasting love and life God gave to us when he sacrificed his

only son, Jesus Christ. The round circular evergreen wreaths are also symbols of eternal life, with no beginning and no end.

When we put our Christmas tree up at Whispering Pines, it is so beautiful, situated in our center lobby. Every resident and guest is in awe of its magnificence when they enter our doors. It truly is the focal point of our building, where we sit and gather to enjoy its beauty.

What a wonderful 400-year-old tradition that Germany immigrants brought to this country, a tradition that is still going strong in all Christian households today!

# History of Hanukkah

The Jewish holiday of Hanukkah comes every year around the same time as Christians celebrate Christmas. Many Christians see the Menorah candelabrum out for display and wonder, "Why aren't all the candles lit?" There is a reason why they are lit on eight consecutive days.

Hanukkah is known as the "Festival of Lights" because over the span of eight days, Jewish people around the world light one candle each night during the evening meal and share with friends and family traditional symbolic foods, saying prayers together and retelling the history of Hanukkah.

According to legend, Jews rose up against their Greek Syrian oppressors in the Maccabean Revolt. When the Jewish people retook the Second Temple back from their oppressors, they needed to let other Jews know of their success and bring others to support the takeover. They decided to use their sacred Menorah candelabrum, which had seven branches to represent knowledge and creation. When they went to light the menorah candles, there was not enough oil to let the others know the temple was being rededicated to the Jewish people. Miraculously, with very little oil, the menorah stayed lit for eight days!

Today, the Menorah has nine branches to represent the eight days of rededication of the temple, and the middle candle is called the shamash (aka "the helper").

European Christians also often displayed a single lit candle in windows to indicate to other Christians they were welcome to come inside and worship with them.

In 1880, Edward Johnson was an inventor under the supervision of Thomas Edison and created the first
