




January Resident Spotlight

On Veterans Day, Mary Wilson, aka "MJ," touched our hearts with her words. She began her story as a teenager who was working and very much into the fashion trends and especially investing in clothing. This was during war time, and

two of her brothers had enlisted. MJ felt guilty about her lifestyle of working to stay in fashion. She took her clothes and spread them out on the grass and sold them. She then went to her parents and asked them to sign for her to enlist and serve in the war with her brothers.

MJ went to Camp Barkley for Technical Nursing and Physical Therapy training. She vividly remembers having to make her bed so tight that a quarter could bounce off of it. Once trained, MJ served at a cardiac hospital. Most of the patients had rheumatic fever and many did not survive. Along with her care, comfort, love and support, MJ also gave blood regularly, directly to the person needing it. She had the opportunity to stay in the military and become an officer, but MJ wanted to move on from the heartbreaking sorrow and the loss



she had endured. She was looking forward to marriage and children in her future. MJ did marry and have a family, and because of that, she was not allowed to become a nurse, since a woman with children did not have that opportunity. In 1975, things changed

and MJ became a nurse!

MJ is 96 years old and twice widowed, has three children, 13 grandchildren and 20 greatgrandchildren. She knows that she survived life-threatening circumstances, with the Lord's guidance, on many occasions. She has been blessed to be able to travel all over the world. Her passion is to advocate for domestic violence and she is proud of her volunteer time and her service at the VFW, aiding veterans.

Mary Wilson says the key to happiness for her has been to stay busy doing good and to live life excitedly.
