

Resident Spotlight

This month's resident spotlight is on Bobbie (Roberta) Taylor, who moved to Cypress Springs in July of 2016 from Port Richey, Florida. She was born at home in April of 1927 in Seattle, Washington, the youngest of three girls. Like many who were impacted by the loss of jobs during the Depression, in 1934, her father obtained employment with the Government Printing Office in Washington, D.C., and



moved east. The next year, the family joined him. In her senior year of high school, she joined the Civil Air Patrol Cadets, and took flying lessons, which were free. After graduation, she worked as a stenographer, moving up to legal secretary and then Executive Secretary at a hospital in Bethesda, Maryland. During the war, she sang with the USO, and was booked with bands in the Washington, D.C. area, in addition to her day job. In May of 1946, she married and had three children. After 24 years of marriage, they were divorced. Not having had the opportunity to go to college after high school, she started college classes after work in 1967, and continued after moving to Florida in 1985. She remarried an Army Veteran in 1984, and was married 23 more years. They enjoyed dancing, and they sang in local shows in Pasco County. He passed away in 2005 from Alzheimer's. Bobbie has had many interests, which included singing in bands and choirs most of her adult life, couturier sewing, painting, writing and public speaking; but foremost is dancing, which she has done since the age of four. As macular degeneration lessened her ability to see well enough to drive, to see fine lines to do portraits or definitive work, or to see a straight line to sew with a machine, she still looks at the positive side. Her attitude is if you cannot do things the way you used to do them, adapt to a new way. She paints more loosely, sews by hand by feeling her way, and participates in our activities with different costumes whenever possible. Her motto is to show kindness to others and approach each day with positive thoughts and thankfulness.

Do You Know a Eula?

Eula as a girl's name is related to the Greek name "Eulalia" and the Scandinavian, Celtic and Hawaiian name "Ula." The meaning of Eula is "well-spoken." Currently, neither name is given to more than a handful of girls each year. Eula reached its apex rank of No. 126 in the U.S. in the 1900s, but is not found on the list currently.

I had never met a Eula, ever! I was blessed to meet a second Eula when she stayed with us for the winter two years ago. Well, she is back! I am so excited to write this article about my favorite Eulas!

Eula Russell is 87 years young and originally from Beckley, West Virginia. Eula was married to a Navy Veteran for 62 years. She has two children, one grandchild and one great-grandchild.

Eula Midyett is 94 years young and is originally from Hale, Missouri. Eula was married to an Air Force Veteran also for 62 years. She has four children, six grandchildren and ten greatgrandchildren.

Both Eulas are very sweet, kind, and they both like to play the horses!




