Teamwork — No Really, This Team Works!



Happy 100th Birthday

Basil James Street was born in Buladean, North Carolina, April 10, 1920, the middle son of Marie and Garrett Street. After high school, Basil drove a logging truck for a local lumber company. He migrated to Maryland as a member of the Civil Conservation Corps. While a CCC, one of the projects he was assigned to was building roads at Camp Hi in the Catoctin Recreational Area of Maryland. This later became Camp David, the presidential retreat for FDR. Basil volunteered for the US Army in January 1941. Basil trained as a medic and a mechanic in the 32nd Medical Battalion and served in Medical Intelligence as a colonel's aide, working in France, Germany, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Switzerland and Austria. After VE Day Basil had the unusual opportunity to tour Hitler's Alpine hideout, known as the Crow's Nest.

In August 1941, he married the love of his life, Pansy Louise. They had two daughters, Anna Lee and Mamie Rea, three grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

After his discharge in November 1945, Basil returned to the States and began working at the Black & Decker Mfg. Co., which he retired from in 1981. He and Pansy bought property in the Daytona Beach area of Florida where they lived until 2007. In 2007, they moved to Lawrenceville to be close to Mamie Rea because of Pansy's declining health.

Basil was a member of the Lions Club, the Manchester Volunteer Fire Department for many years, and the American Legion. Basil was an avid hunter and fisherman. After Pansy's death, Basil stayed active taking care of his home and lawn, spending time with his family and friends, activities at Lawrenceville Presbyterian Church. In April, last year, he experienced some health issues, and then suffered a fall resulting in a broken arm. Basil decided to sell his home, and moved to Linwood Estates in March.



Memorial Day 2020

Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in military service for the United States.

While there is some dispute as to the origin of the day, the first Decoration Day was observed on May 30, 1868, under proclamation by General John A. Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic. The first official observation involved placing flowers on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery with James Garfield (later president) delivering a speech.

In 1868, about 5,000 people decorated graves at Arlington National Cemetery's first Memorial Day ceremony. About the same number of people still gather there annually. By 1890, it was recognized by all of the Northern states. The South refused to acknowledge the day, honoring their dead on separate days until after World War I (when the holiday changed from honoring just those who died fighting in the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war). Memorial Day was celebrated on May 30th up to 1971 when the National Holiday Act of 1971, designated the last Monday in May to be the federal holiday.

Each year, the president requests that all governors of the United States direct the flag to be flown at half-staff until noon on Memorial Day on all buildings, grounds and naval vessels. U.S. citizens are also asked to display the flag at half-staff from their homes before noon.

We at Linwood, recognize the importance of our military families and are very proud of our Wall of Honor, which honors all our military veterans who live in our Community.

- The second-largest doll is not yellow.

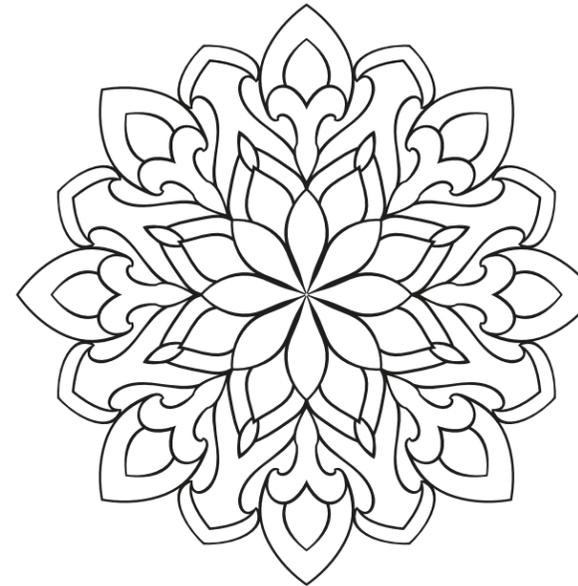


Simple Ways To Practice Mindfulness

- Savor a snack. Whether it's a crisp, fresh apple or a decadent candy bar, enjoy a snack slowly and deliberately. Close your eyes and think about the food's flavors and textures and the rhythm of your chewing.
- Enjoy nature — even from indoors. Look out your window to study birds and plants. Notice as much detail as you can. Or look at a nature photo from a book or the internet and gaze at it peacefully.
- Set aside specific times of the day to read a meaningful poem, quotation, mantra or prayer.
- Download a free guided meditation app. Search "meditation" in your device's app store to see available options.

Mandala Meditation

From a Sanskrit word meaning "circle," a mandala is a popular tool used in meditation, often representing wholeness. You may have seen a mandala without realizing what it was. Simply stated, it is a circular shape filled with repeating geometric patterns. Creating your own mandala — by drawing at least three concentric circles, then filling in the spaces between the circles with various shapes — can be therapeutic and relaxing. Coloring or painting pre-drawn mandalas has the same effect.



A Dose of Deep Breathing

Deep breathing, also known as belly breathing, can help alleviate stress, increase relaxation and lower heart rate and blood pressure. You can do it almost anywhere. Breathe in slowly through your nose for four counts until your abdomen feels fully expanded, hold your breath for one count, then exhale through your mouth for five counts. Experts recommend doing this three times an hour.




