Flower for the Month

The rose is the flower for the month of June. The name "rose" is derived from the Latin word "rosa." During the height of Rome, roses were grown extensively in the Middle East and used as medicine, perfumes, and

at celebrations as confetti. The rose is generally known to signify love, beauty, honor, faith and devotion. The meaning of the rose depends on its color. Red roses mean "I love you." Red and white roses together symbolize unity. Pink roses symbolize perfect happiness. White roses symbolize innocence and purity. Yellow roses symbolize friendship or jealousy. A bouquet of roses signifies sincere gratitude while giving a single stem amplifies the meaning of the color.

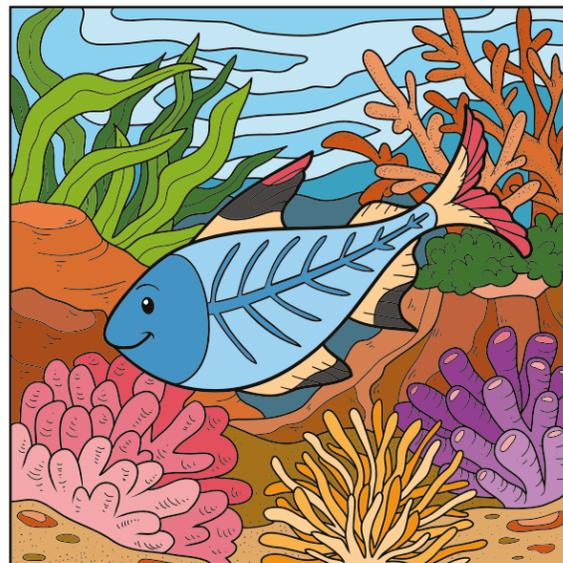
