Here is another update regarding our status with this COVID-19. Please be sure and follow the protocols for visiting your loved ones. We have the chairs spaced out 6 feet and it is indicated with black tape. Please do not move the chairs!

Iowa Outdoor Visitation Guidance 6/30/20

Iowa SHM may allow outdoor visitation for residents when certain conditions are met. Visitations must be limited to two visitors at a time per resident. The maximum number of residents and visitors in the outdoors space at one time is predicated on the size of the outdoor space. The community must ensure that a minimum distancing of six feet is achievable in the outdoor space when determining the maximum number of residents and visitors who can simultaneously occupy that outdoor space. The community must clearly communicate and enforce social distancing of six feet between the resident and all visitors.

The facility must set the maximum number of visitors allowed in a single day.

Visitors must schedule an appointment with the facility to visit a resident. The community must prescreen visitors via phone with the [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](https://www.cdc.gov/media/releases/2020/s0624-covid-19-checklist) (CDC) symptom checklist not more than 24 hours in advance. The facility must also screen visitors on arrival with the SHM symptom screening checklist and a temperature check. Residents with active COVID-19 infection, either laboratory confirmed or symptomatic, are not allowed to participate in outdoor visits. Residents receiving visitors should also be screened with the CDC symptom checklist prior to visitor's arrival. Visitors displaying symptoms should not visit the facility.

Visits must be limited to outdoor areas only. However, they may take place under a canopy or tent without walls. Outdoor spaces must have separate ingress and egress which does not require the visitor to enter the community building. Visitors must not enter the community at any time during their visit. For the duration of each visit, the resident and visitor must wear a face covering. The facility may set the time duration of each visit.

The facility should have staff supervision during each visit to ensure the use of face coverings and social distancing. The community may determine whether supervision is continuous or intermittent.

Residents have been enjoying eating in the dining room on real plates, silverware, cups! We will continue to add activities as long as the infection stays out of Glenwood Place. I really appreciate everyone in this community for helping to keep us safe and COVID free. It takes all of us from each and every one of the staff and all of you my residents and family --- so thank you all!






CDC recommends a three-step approach to fighting influenza (flu). The first and most important step is to get a flu vaccination each year. But if you get the flu, there are prescription antiviral drugs that can treat your illness. Early treatment is especially important for the elderly, the very young, people with certain chronic health conditions, and pregnant women. Finally, everyday preventive actions may slow the spread of germs that cause respiratory (nose, throat, and lungs) illnesses, like flu. Glenwood Place Safety Procedures

What We Do to Keep You Safe in the Event of a Tornado

In the event of severe weather in our area, the Glenwood Place staff is responsible in keeping you or your loved one safe. On July 19th, at 3:30 in the afternoon, our staff was put to the test when our phones alarmed us of a tornado warning in Marshall County. There are specific steps our staff takes in ensuring all residents are aware of the warning.

1. Staff immediately starts notifying every apartment and individual that there is a tornado warning
2. Residents have the choice to remain in their apartment or be escorted to the basement or another interior room.
3. Once a staff member has made contact with the resident and checked apartment, we place the orange door tag on the outside of the apartment. This tells other staff that the resident in that apartment has been notified and we have communicated that severe weather is coming.
4. Staff and residents will remain in safe areas until the warning has expired.

For this tornado, we had ample warning time before the tornado hit. This may not always be the case. Your bathroom is the safest place to ride out severe weather. If you do not have time to get to our lower level, sit in your shower until staff arrives. We encourage all of you to get a weather radio to keep on at all times. Many of you did not know there was a warning, and many said they did not hear the tornado sirens while in the building. To keep yourself safe and help staff be efficient in getting you to a safe area in the building, please always try to be aware of the weather. Listen to those radios and tv weather reports!
