The Words of MI K

In honor of Martin Luther King Jr. Day on January 18th, here are some of his most enduring speeches.

Montgomery bus boycott speech — One of King's first public speeches took place on December 5th, 1955, in Alabama, just a few days after Rosa Parks was arrested for refusing to give up her bus seat. His inspiring words about peaceful protests launched his role as a leader of the civil rights movement.

"I Have a Dream" — King delivered these iconic words from the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C., on August 28th, 1963. Over 250,000 people gathered there and heard King describe his vision of the future, where his children "will not be judged by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character."

Nobel Peace Prize speech — In 1964, King was 35 and at the time, was the youngest person to win the Nobel Peace Prize. Accepting the honor on December 10th, 1964, he described the beauty of brotherhood and peace as "more precious than diamonds or silver or gold."

"How Long, Not Long" — On March 25th, 1965, after marching with 25,000 protesters from Selma to the Alabama Capitol in Montgomery, King encouraged the crowd, saying, "The road ahead is not altogether a smooth one. ... But we must keep going."

"I've Been to the Mountaintop" — King gave his final address in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 3rd, 1968, the night before he was assassinated. Speaking to a group of striking city workers, King emphasized the importance of unity in the fight for justice.



Ashburn Folklore and History

Ashburn Village has a unique history as well as a local legend on how it got its name. Ashburn Village had its beginnings in Loudoun County as Farmwell or Farmwell Station, named after the nearby farm, that belonged to George Lee. This land was part of a larger tract of 11,182 acres of land that his great-grandfather, Thomas Lee, patented in 1719 and remained in the family until 6.482 acres of it was sold to Loudoun & Hampshire Railroad (also known as Washington & Old Dominion Railroad), and to the town of Alexandria in 1859. The Lee family was one of wealthiest families at the time in Loudoun County." In the mid 1800s, the Lee family sold part of the remaining land to John Janney a local lawyer, politician and Quaker. The Lee

and Janney families both owned more than 600 acres. According to legend, this land that John Janney bought from the Lee family was how Ashburn got its name. Residents claimed that a huge ash tree that was by John Janney's home was struck by lightning, creating a huge glow and burned and smoked for several days. It created quite a buzz in the community and a large number of local residents came to see the ash tree burn. By 1895, former Nevada Senator, William Morris Stewart bought Ashburn Farm from the Janneys and turned it into a dairy farm which reportedly became the first dairy farm in Loudoun County to pasteurize milk with steam. William Stewart worked with the railroad to deliver his dairy farm products from Loudoun County to Washington, D.C. and established Farmwell Railroad Station. In 1896, after numerous mix ups by the railroad for mail delivery between Farmwell and Farmville, Stewart argued that the handwritten names were too similar and that Farmwell name should be changed and the village officially became Ashburn to match the name of his nearby farm.
