She worked at Republic National Bank in downtown Dallas as a teller/auditor, using an adding machine! Because she worked nights, the bank provided taxi service to and from work. In 1980, Jean married a Texas rancher and gained a fifth daughter. Jean and Al had a life of retirement together which gave them opportunities to travel in over 40 countries and six continents. They spent 16,000 hours of volunteer work at Baylor Hospital in Garland and numerous hours square dancing together.

After Jean's husband passed away in 2014, her pastor came for a visit. The pastor recommended she move to Liberty Heights. Jean is very grateful for that visit! She came to Liberty Heights the same year and made new friends. She enjoys activities like Bingo, with her friend Nancy, Ladies' Bible Class, leading the daily "Move It or Lose It" program, listening to the Revelation Series in the Chapel and attending the Activity Room Church Services.

As Jean says, it has been a comfort and joy living in a safe, friendly Christian atmosphere.
