A Message From Julia

Hello!

While we all hope and wish that this pandemic will end soon, we need to be prepared that it will continue for an unknown period. As a reminder, Governor Ducey created a "Task Force" last month to outline how and when assisted living communities can open and open safely. Because we are a licensed assisted living community and regulated by the Department of Health Services, I am unable to lift current restrictions until we receive further guidance and instruction. Hopefully by the time you are reading this, our state has made safe moves in this direction.

As a reminder, residents are only permitted to leave the community for necessary medical appointments only. If you need assistance with picking up prescriptions, we are available to do so on Mondays, Tuesdays, or Thursdays. If you need assistance for obtaining grocery items, please notify the Concierge and someone will assist you with setting up online delivery service. Only necessary health care professionals may enter the community. Family members of those residents on hospice care are also permitted to visit.

Please continue to wear a mask whenever you are out of your apartment and ensure that you are socially distancing while dining and especially during all activities. This does not mean that you can visit with friends or family members outside on the patios. Please, I ask all of you to kindly follow these rules. We must stand together and stay vigilant for the health and welfare of you, your neighbors and team members.

Patriot Day

The nation's annual remembrance of 9/11, Patriot Day is also a National Day of Service. Since 2002, people across America pay tribute to the victims, survivors and heroes of Sept. 11 by volunteering in community service projects. The start times for each minute of silence in Eastern Time, as provided by the 9/11 Memorial & Museum, are as follows: 8:46 a.m.: Hijackers deliberately crash American Airlines Flight 11 into floors 93 through 99 of the North Tower (1 WTC). 9:03 a.m.: Hijackers deliberately crash United Airlines Flight 175 into floors 77 through 85 of the South Tower (2 WTC). 9:37 a.m.: Hijackers deliberately crash American Airlines Flight 77 into the Pentagon, near Washington, D.C. 9:59 a.m.: The South Tower (2 WTC) collapses. 10:03 a.m.: After learning of the other attacks, passengers on

United Airlines Flight 93 launch a counterattack on hijackers aboard their plane to try to seize control of the aircraft. In response, the hijackers crash the plane into an empty field near Shanksville, Pa.

10:28 a.m.: The North Tower (1 WTC) collapses. The 16-acre World Trade Center site is in ruins, with collateral damage affecting all adjacent properties and streets. A rescue and recovery effort begins immediately.

Important Information for Voting in the General Election

The General Election is Tuesday, November 3rd this year. The deadline to register to vote in Arizona is Monday, October 5th. If you have not already done so, please make sure you have changed your address to the Quail Park address which is:

The Activity department will provide transportation to a polling station on election day, so be sure you have changed your address and registered to vote prior to October 5th.

You will need to present one form of identification from List #1 or two different forms of identification from List #2. List #1 -

- Valid Arizona driver license
- Valid Arizona non-operating identification card
- Valid United States federal, state, or local government-issued identification
 List #2 -
- Utility bill of the elector that is dated within 90 days of the date of the election with your current address.
- Bank or credit union statement that is dated within 90 days of the date of the election
- Valid Arizona Vehicle Registration
