UK Family receives World War II-era Letter 77 Years After it was Sent

Everyone appreciates receiving letters from a loved one – even if they don't arrive exactly on time. When the family of Bill Baldwell, a now-passed World War II veteran,

received a message from a distant relative, they were shocked to learn that they had received a unique letter specifically addressed to their childhood home. Written in Bill's handwriting, the letter was dated as having come from the year 1943.

"It was the most surreal thing on a Friday night to suddenly read a postcard that dad had written 77 years ago when he was training to be a sailor in the Navy," said Bill's daughter, Joanna Creamer.

The Royal Mail admits that they don't know why the delivery took so long, but they speculate that the letter had been found and reposted. Having concluded his naval career with four medals from his time spent in Europe, the Pacific, Japan,





and Australia, Bill's words tell the story of a young man whose journey in the service was just beginning:

"Well I am in blue at last. I did not think it would be like this—you don't get much time for yourself, do you? But I like it alright. I will write a letter to you all when I get half a chance so will you hold on a bit? I have 19 weeks here yet. Give my love to everyone. Love, Bill."


