Juliette Gordon Low envisioned an organization that would prepare girls to meet their world with courage, confidence, and character.

In 1912, in the midst of the Progressive Era — and at a time when women in the United States couldn't yet vote — this nearly deaf 51-year-old sparked a worldwide movement inspiring girls to embrace, together, their individuality, strength, and intellect.

Juliette, affectionately known as "Daisy" by her family and close friends, gathered 18 girls in her hometown of Savannah, Georgia, to share what she had learned abroad about a new outdoor and educational program for youth, and with this, the Girl Scout Movement was born. Along with Juliette, these first Girl Scouts blazed trails and redefined what was possible for themselves and for girls everywhere.

## Dr. Seuss Day

March 2nd was National Dr. Seuss Day and at Maple Ridge, we love to celebrate it with Dr. Seuss games, hats, fun facts and book readings of his silly works. We had Will, West, and Wren Calcote come and read to us three fun, silly books that really put some smiles on residents' faces.

Theodore Seuss Geisel, born March 2, 1904, died September 24, 1991, was an American children's author, political cartoonist, illustrator, poet, animator, and filmmaker. He is known for his work writing and illustrating more than 60 books under the pen name Dr. Seuss. His work includes many of the most popular children's books of all time, selling over 600 million copies and being translated into more than 20 languages by the time of his death.

Geisel adopted the name "Dr. Seuss" as an undergraduate at Dartmouth College and as a graduate student at Lincoln College, Oxford. He left Oxford in 1927 to begin his career as an illustrator and cartoonist for Vanity Fair, Life, and various other publications. He also worked as an illustrator for advertising campaigns, most notably for FLIT and Standard Oil, and as a political cartoonist for the New York newspaper, PM. He published his first children's book, "And to Think That I Saw It on Mulberry Street," in 1937. During World War II, he took a brief hiatus from children's literature to illustrate political cartoons, and he also worked in the animation and film department of the United States Army where he wrote, produced or animated many productions — both live-action and animated — including "Design for Death," which later won the 1947 Academy Award for Best Documentary Feature.

After the war, Geisel returned to writing children's books, writing classics like, "If I Ran the Zoo" (1950), "Horton Hears a Who!" (1955), "If I Ran the Circus" (1956), "The Cat in the Hat" (1957), "How the Grinch Stole Christmas!" (1957), and "Green Eggs and Ham" (1960). He published over 60 books during his career, which have spawned numerous adaptations, including 11 television specials, five feature films, a Broadway musical, and four television series.

Geisel won the Lewis Carroll Shelf Award in 1958 for "Horton Hatches the Egg."

There are many of her students who have gone into math-based careers because of her outstanding attention to each of them, individually. She always had a smile for me, and she always let me know how important I was to her. She taught for around 25 years at Quitman High School. What a difference you made in my life when you invested in me, Mrs. Geneva Johnson!
