## Beverly Shows Her Gratitude to Truck Drivers with Hundreds of Thank-You Cards

When COVID-19 first struck, what were once everyday jobs quickly became known as “essential businesses.” Among this unique and necessary workforce were truck drivers – round-the-clock workers tasked with delivering anything and everything to a population sheltering from a global pandemic. Fortunately, their work hasn’t gone unappreciated.

Beverly Perrin, an Ontario senior with no shortage of love to give, spent the early days of quarantine with her husband, Dick, creating 75 to 100 “thank-you” cards for truck drivers, which the pair would then deliver to a nearby truck-stop once every three to four weeks. Truck drivers would often find themselves surprised when they would find Beverly’s personalized message of gratitude:

“Thank you so much for bringing supplies to our stores. Even though it is sometimes under harsh circumstances. Take care. Stay safe. God’s blessing on you always. Love Beverly Perrin, a very grateful senior.”

Since beginning their campaign of kindness in April of 2020, Beverly and Dick have shared over 1,000 thank-you cards to shocked, but grateful essential workers.

“When I first started doing it, they just kind of looked at me like, ‘Really?’” Perrin told CBC news. “One trucker asked me, ‘How much do I pay you?’ [I told him] it’s just from me to you, as a senior—that we so appreciate you.”
