THERAPEUTIC MASSAGE: An Alternative to Pain Management

Interest in use of complementary and alternative medicine, like therapeutic massage, has grown significantly in recent years. Therapeutic massage is a focused, results-oriented approach targeting the causes of chronic pain or injuries. Therapeutic massage can target specific areas of discomfort.

Therapeutic massage may relieve pain by way of several mechanisms, including relaxing painful muscles, tendons, and joints; relieving stress and anxiety, improves mood, increasing oxygenation of body tissues, aiding in sleep, and possibly helping to "close the pain gate" by stimulating competing nerve fibers and impeding pain messages to and from the brain.

There are 4 basic massage movements:

Effleurage: Consists of long, soothing, stroking movements which are performed using the flat of the hand or fingers.

Petrissage: Involves movements which involve various ways of kneading, rolling and picking up the skin and muscles.

Friction: Requires using the thumb, fingertips or knuckles, with deep direct pressure to one particular site of muscular tension.

Tapotement: Sometimes termed as percussion movements, entails the fast and stimulating pounding with the hands.


