Dear Residents and Family Members,

We have received some very welcome news from the CDC and our state officials in the past week about easing of mask restrictions in indoor and outdoor settings to those individuals that are fully vaccinated. We are thrilled to have almost 100% of our resident population vaccinated across our portfolio. Because of these changes, we will follow the recommendations and all fully vaccinated residents may navigate throughout our communities and common spaces without wearing a mask.

We will continue to follow capacity restrictions and our staff must still adhere to masking protocols until further restrictions are lifted.

- ➤ Our dining rooms remain at 50% capacity for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. No outside guests will be allowed to dine while we remain at 50% capacity to ensure we can accommodate all residents that wish to dine in the dining rooms. Meal delivery will remain available at a nominal delivery charge.
- ➤ Guests will be allowed to visit the communities between 8am-8pm. All guests must enter through the main entrance and complete the health log. All guests will be required to wear a mask when indoors at our communities.
- > Group activities will remain at no more than 25 residents or the capacity that the room can accommodate while still achieving proper social distancing.
- > Small group outings on the bus will continue for essential leisure trips. The bus will be limited to 50% capacity. Individual transportation remains available for both essential and leisure trips.

All caregivers and support staff must continue to wear their masks and enter through the main entrance of the community so they can complete the guest log and have their temperature taken. We will continue to monitor federal state and local restrictions closely over the coming weeks and will follow up with subsequent communications as these modifications take place.
