I wrote this column in June in 2018, and my father passed away just a short month after this was published....I'll share it again as a tribute to my wonderful father as we approach Father's Day.

My dad grew up in Greenwald, Minnesota. His father was the town barber, and the shop was also located in their home. He had an older brother and a younger sister.

My father and mother grew up in the same town of about 500 people, she was a farm girl, and he was one of the town boys. They married shortly after my father enlisted in the US Army. Their first home was in San Francisco at the army base, but they made their way back to the Midwest and settled in Fridley, Minnesota where my father was an accountant for a firm in Roseville, Minnesota,

They quickly started a family and as many of you know and settled on a perfect dozen. The first 10 came very quickly... yearly in fact (nice Catholic family). There are 7 girls and 5 boys in our family. My father was guiet, very spiritual man with a very hands-on approach as well, you could find him any day making beds, hanging laundry out on the line, giving baths at night (one bathroom), baking cookies, teaching us how to drive, ride our bikes, baiting many hooks on our numerous camping trips to Lake Bemidji or camping along the Great Lakes.

One afternoon as I raced my brother home from the bus stop, we found him putting together bread, it had risen and spilled all over the counter, as he proudly announced that we had welcomed another brother to our family!

Weeknights were spent with trips to the local lakes with our picnic dinners and swimming throughout the summer months. Winter months were spent on the local ice rink playing hockey with the entire neighborhood. My dad built us a playhouse and with one of the numerous tornadoes that swept through Minnesota, it landed on its side and became a fort from that day forward. Many stories abound but one of my favorites is when us older children started driving, and daily he would tell us to SLOW DOWN when we drove into the driveway, "you're going to go right through the garage door to the other side someday" were his exact words. (I cannot imagine that would happen since the 15 -year -old Ford station wagon never went faster than 15mph!) So, on this very cold and icy night we were waiting as we usually did for my father to come home from work and as we saw the headlights against the garage door, we knew it was time to get the supper on the table. So as the older children gathered around the supper table, we heard this crash and so the story goes....my father came through the door and all he said was "not a word kids" and you know we never did discuss the garage door or the reason why my father's car went entirely through the garage door that late evening, but you know there were many hidden giggles at the dinner table that night.

My father was a great role model for us all, a quiet man with a sense of humor. He taught us to put God first and the rest will come.



Staying properly hydrated is important all year round, however with the Summer heat it is vital we are drinking the appropriate amount of water each day. Health experts say to aim for half your body weight in ounces of water each day. That means
