We also ask that you fill out a "Pink Sheet" that is the POLST paperwork that is to be posted on your refrigerator or the inside of a kitchen cabinet door for the First Responders to know your wishes. If you do not have a copy of this pink sheet, please call or come by the front desk and they will assist you in getting one. No one ever likes talking about this concern, but reality is...we must be aware so that we, Golden Pond can better serve and protect you with as much information as possible so that you can continue to live your life to its fullest. We are honored to serve you and provide many wonderful opportunities to stay busy and remain engaged. So, we thank you in advance for helping us, help you.
