Discussion

Written by Irving Berlin, this song was an instant hit. At its first performance as part of the musical *Betsy*, the audience requested 24 encores! The star, Belle Baker, must have gotten tired because during the last repetition she forgot the words and Irving Berlin had to sing them from the front row.

When the Red, Red Robin Comes Bob, Bob, Bobbin' Along

Discussion

This was the signature song of actress Lillian Roth, whose life story was the subject of the movie "I'll Cry Tomorrow." The song has been covered by many other artists and helped inspire the name of the hamburger restaurant "Red Robin". The owner of the restaurant chain sang in a barbershop quartet and this was one of his favorite songs, so he decided to call his restaurant "Sam's Red Robin" which was later shortened to just "Red Robin".

If you owned a restaurant, what would you call it? What food would you serve? Tell about one of your favorite restaurants.

A Nightingale Sang in Berkley Square

Discussion

Berkley Square is a public garden in Westminster, London. (See attached pictures.) It would be unusual to hear a nightingale in this setting because nightingales usually prefer more rural habitats.

Listen to the birdsongs on the playlist and see if you can identify the type of bird. What type of birds would you see or hear where you lived? Did you have a birdfeeder to try to attract birds?

There'll Be Bluebirds Over the White Cliffs of Dover

Discussion

This famous song from WWII looks ahead to a time of peace when the sky would be filled with birds instead of warplanes. Unfortunately, lyricist Nat Burton did not realize that bluebirds are not native to England.

If you wrote a poem or song now, what things would you be looking forward to?

What are some signs of spring? See attached photos for some hints.

Discussion

This song also talks about bluebirds! It was almost omitted from the movie The Wizard of Oz because they thought it didn't fit the image of "a little girl singing in a barnyard."

Note: This song was used by segregationists who played it over loudspeakers to taunt blacks during the Selma/Montgomery marches, but it is intended to be a song of hope for a better day. Many black artists have covered the song before and since, including John Coltrane who won a Grammy for his version which lasted 18 minutes!
