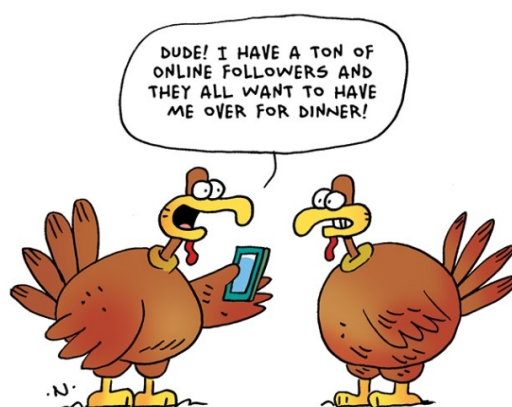
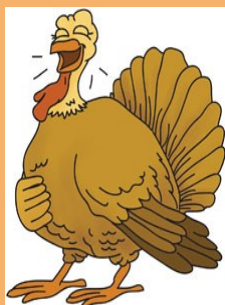
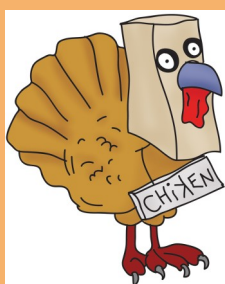




Some Great Things About Getting Older (Submitted by Lenice Horne)
