Get Out and Vote

Election day is right around the corner and we want to encourage all of you to exercise your right to vote. Voting is one of the most important things that you can do for your country and community. Elected officials determine the rules and regulations that impact all of us on a daily basis.

There are three ways you can register to vote. You can register to vote online through Oct. 23, or you can register in-person at an early polling location or on election day (<u>enter your address</u> for information on your nearest in-person voting location). To be eligible to vote in Utah, you must be 18 years old and have one <u>primary</u> form of ID or two forms of a secondary ID that prove your name and current residence.

Covid-19 Update

Utah leaders rolled out the Covid-19 Transmission Index earlier this week, which uses local data to determine if restriction levels need to be high, moderate or low based on case rates and ICU utilization. The Transmission Index replaces the previous color-coded guidelines.

The state asks anyone experiencing flulike symptoms to get tested at one of the <u>testing locations throughout the state</u>. There is assistance available if you are <u>currently</u> <u>uninsured</u>.
