

Mae Mandel

In preparation to recognize Memorial Day, I interviewed Mae, one of our residents who has experienced over 100 years of history. Mae was born in 1920. In 1940, on her way home from working at Brown and Bigelow, during a memorably unforseen snowstorm in the Twin Cities, she got stranded at a street car stop. It was in those few hours that she met Larry, the love of her life. In Mae's words, Larry was "sweet all the way down to the tips of his toes". He also dreamed of serving his country in the U.S. Navy. She supported him in his goals, and he signed up for 6 years.

Then spending much of their first few years together traveling across the world as their relationship grew through letters and trust. They got married in 1944, when he was home for a leave, and welcomed their first child, a girl, in 1945. Larry was home with them for a day after baby Marty arrived, and then deployed for another 15 months. He was honorably discharged at the end of his term in 1948, shortly before the birth of their second child, Tim. They began a new chapter following this, creating a beautiful life and family that they shared for over 60 years.



I asked Mae about the most valuable thing they learned as a couple, going through the experience of being apart while he served. She confidently answered "Faith". In a situation where so many things were out of their hands, continuing to be there for each other and pray for each other connected them. She got emotional telling me that there were so many times when they looked back and realized that they had faced dangers and obstacles they often didn't even recognize in the moment but they came out safe and happy on the other side. She said she could not have had a better partner to go through life with. As the world around us continues to struggle, stories like Mae's are a ray of hope. Throughout history, love and persistence have prevailed through wars, economic declines and cultural revolutions of all kinds. The media shows us examples of every kind of disheartening news, but don't forget that in our everyday lives we are surrounded by real stories that can remind us there is so much good, too. 
