Resident of the Month: Nancy M.

I was born in Dubuque, Iowa on December 13, 1950, to Richard Keith and Leola (Schaal) Skaife. I was a premature baby and was not able to come home for 68 days. My dad worked for Farley and Loetscher Manufacturing Company making windows and doors. At that time, it was one of the largest millwork plants in the world. Later he worked for John Deere Manufacturing Company in Dubuque. His final career change was into construction, building bridges and sewer plants. My mother had many skills, but she also had seven children, so her career didn't really start until later. She went back to school and became a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) at Good Samaritan Hospital in Dubuque, a position she held for 26.5 years. She then worked for Land's End for 10 years in Dodgeville until she retired. I was the oldest of our seven children, which meant I had plenty of childcare and household duties as we all grew up together. We lived with my grandparents until I was three years old. Then we moved into our own place in the country when my siblings came along. Patricia in 1953, Trudy 1955, Gary 1956, Elaine 1957, Michael 1961 and finally Brian in 1964. I started school in a one-room schoolhouse. I was the only girl in 1st and 2nd grade. When I was in the 5th grade we moved to Lancaster where we went to school. I graduated from Lancaster High School in 1970. During school I was active in 4-H and Future Homemakers of America (FHA). My grandma owned a ceramics, porcelain, and china shop. She got me involved in ceramics at a young age, which gave me my love of crafts throughout my life. I was their

first grandchild, so they really spoiled me! I had worked in the hospital kitchen during high school and following graduation I got my CNA designation at the technical school. I only worked as a CNA at Broomfield Manor for three months before I got married to Robert Nauertz in 1972. He was in the Air Force, and he was transferred to Fairbanks, Alaska. After Alaska, we moved to Massachusetts and then Wichita, Kansas. While in Wichita, our trailer home was destroyed by a tornado. Luckily, we were not home at the time. When Robert left the military, we moved back to Wisconsin near Richland Center. In 1984-85 I decided to go back to school at SW Technical College in Fennimore to become a baker. Sadly, my marriage with Robert did not last, and we finally divorced in 1988. I moved to Madison and worked for Perkins and then Gardner Bakery. Unfortunately, I had an accident at work and injured my back, forcing me to retire in 1990. I met Glen McKinney Jr. in 1990. We dated until 1992 when we were married. He worked for Thousand's Auto Service in Mount Horeb for 23 years. We had a daughter in 1995. Alycen grew up and went to school in Mount Horeb and she still lives in Mount Horeb. We have a great relationship, but she now has COVID so I don't get to see her as often as I would like. Glen and I also fostered a child for a period in our home in Mount Horeb. I was very active with my church, The Evangelical Lutheran Church. Alycen went to the Agape Preschool. I am not able to go to my church now but enjoy visits with Pastor John. Sadly, Glen passed away almost seven years ago. He

developed stage 4 cancer and passed away quickly. My mother is still living with my

brother and sister-in-law in Mount Ida in Grant County. I have remained close with her and some of my siblings throughout my life. I realized recently that I need help because of my medical conditions. I stayed for a short time at a facility in Black Earth. I then entered the UW Hospital for an extended stay due to COVID and damage to my organs from medication issues. At that point, I asked to be moved to Ingleside Communities in Mount Horeb. I came here January 23, 2021. I enjoy baking projects here at Ingleside. I have made wedding and birthday cakes for family members. I have always enjoyed cooking for others. I had quite an adjustment from cooking for my family while I was growing up to just cooking for two people when I got married. When we lived in Alaska, I cooked moose steaks for our neighbors because we couldn't eat such big slabs of meat. I learned to cook many things and enjoyed every bit of it. I also love craft projects and I made the 3-D snowflakes on the dining room windows here at Ingleside. I would say that working with ceramics and baking are the things I have enjoyed the most in my life. This all started when I was growing up and spending so much time with my grandma and taking care of my siblings.

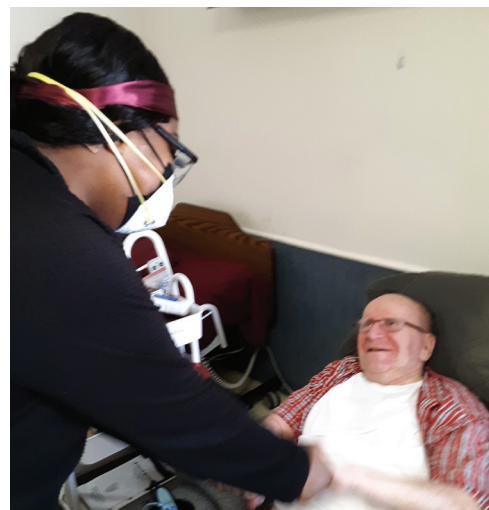
