2022 WALK TO END ALZHEIMERS

Why YOU should join our team for the 2022 WALK TO END ALZHEIMERS

I've worked in senior care for seven years, often helping those with dementia or Alzheimer's disease live their best life possible.

I've advocated for quality patient care. I've met with families searching to find the best environment for their loved ones. And I have supported the Alzheimer's Association's Walk to End Alzheimer's as a way to help my residents.

Then, it happened to me. Alzheimer's invaded my family. That insidious brain disease started rearing its ugly head in my grandmother, whom I affectionately call Yiayia.

That is why this year's Walk to End Alzheimer's is so important to me. This year, I will walk with a different purpose. I am now among the more than 16 million Americans who have a loved one who has Alzheimer's or other dementias.

"The vast majority of the disease is called sporadic, but even in sporadic cases, there can be a familial tendency," says Dr. Ronald Petersen, of the Alzheimer's Disease Research Center at Mayo Clinic.

Sporadic cases tend to happen after age 65. So even if you don't have a known genetic link but do have relatives with Alzheimer's disease, your risk could be double or triple that of the general population. Alzheimer's has no cure and no survivors. But this will change. The first survivor of Alzheimer's is out there, and they're going to hold on to everything the disease steals away. The Alzheimer's Association is going to make it happen. But we won't get there without you.

Do you have a loved one with us who is living with Alzheimer's disease or another form of dementia? Would you be willing to share your story?
