Residents of the Month: Laura F.

I was born on September 15, 1927, on a farm near Elroy, Wisconsin. My parents, Charles and Esther Miller, were farmers. I had three brothers, Rhiney, Clarence and Bernard and one sister, Bernice. We all had plenty of chores on our farm. I learned to tend the horses, milk the cows, help plant and harvest the crops and bail the hay.

We did have some fun on the farm, playing hide and seek and ball games in the summer and making snow angels and sledding on our favorite hill in the winter months. Our family loved to play cards together, so this kept us entertained year around. We never had time to travel as a family, but I did take part in church outings.

My siblings and I walked to a country school about one half mile from our farm. I attended first through eighth grade there. I went for a year to Mauston High School, then transferred to Wonevok High School and loved it there. I learned to type and other secretarial skills, which served me well in my working career.

I had many friends in high school, both boys and girls. Our school sponsored dances on Wednesday nights and Saturday afternoons. I loved to go there and even met my future husband at the dances. Lloyd F. was a farm boy from nearby Kendall. We dated for a while after I graduated in 1945 and were married January 10, 1947.

Lloyd drove a truck, hauling milk from area farms to the creameries, which required him to work seven days a week. We started our family when son Gary was born in 1948.

Ronald, Chuck, Michael, and Dennis followed. Unfortunately, Ronald died of natural causes at age 18. There were no girls in our family for many years, except for me. The boys kept me very busy.

I moved to the Madison area immediately after high school and worked as a secretary in an office. Lloyd also moved to the Madison area. After we were married, we lived in several small towns around Mount Horeb, but mostly considered Mount Horeb our home. I lived in two different houses at 203 S. First Street and then 319 W. Main Street in Mount Horeb. I love Mount Horeb and enjoyed working in our yard, cooking, and doing housework for my family.

Our boys did very well in the Mount Horeb School System, where they all went through grade school and high school. We occasionally took fishing trips up north in the Hayward area and attended the Evangelical Lutheran Church on Main Street.

I did not work after the children were born but did go back to work when they all left home. I was receptionist and office manager for Guenveur Eyecare on Main Street in Mount Horeb (Now Samuelson Eyecare) for over 20 years. When computers became an important part of the office scene, that was my cue to retire!

After the boys were grown, Lloyd and I divorced, and I later married Barney Dunlevy. Barney worked for the Dane County Highway Department. Barney and I bought a vacation home near Lynxville, WI, right on the Mississippi River. We had so



many friends there that helped me perfect my Euchre skills! We enjoyed this for 15 years after retirement. Unfortunately, Barney passed away a few years ago and I sold our property.

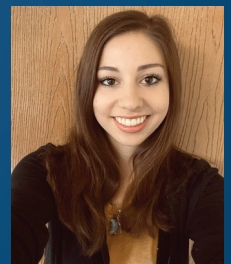
Our family has grown now with four grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. Finally, some girls in our family! I enjoy their visits and phone calls.
