The Honor Flight Network's main purpose is to provide veterans with the opportunity to visit memorials dedicated to their services at no cost to them. In addition to a free flight, these trips include deluxe tour bus service, meals, snacks, t-shirts, and several other amenities. Honor Flight Network also provides trained, volunteer guardians to accompany veterans through the entire trip if the veteran is without one.

This past July, Trilogy resident Roger McCombs embarked on his own Honor Flight adventure. As a veteran of World War II, he was able to speak with several other WWII service members from the area and take an Honor Flight through the skies of Danville, Kentucky. The spotlight was on
