Resident of the Month: Jack W. Jack was born in Bridgeport, Connecticut in 1935 to Harry and Anna W. Harrv immigrated to the USA in 1902 and was

employed in the electric utility industry. Anna stayed in the house raising the children and taking care of home.

As a boy, Jack had a reputation as someone who followed his passions. He loved to fish, fix up old cars, ride motorcycles and get into mischief with his buddies. He was 10 years old when World War 2 ended.

Jack enjoyed lithography and during his high school years began taking training to become a printing press operator. He was 15 years old at the start of the Korean War. After high school he joined the Navy and was stationed in Virginia at Norfolk Naval Base where he continued his trade as a press operator. Jack often jokes that during his 2-years of active duty he "never set foot on a ship". He did, however, meet the love of his life, Annabelle Lee Powell, at one of the naval base facilities; they married six weeks after their first date. They would remain married for 57 years until Annabelle died in 2015.

Jack and Annabelle raised two sons. Every summer they would take their boys on a two-week vacation to a new place in the USA or Canada; fishing, canoeing, camping, and Disneyland to name a few. They lived in Tulsa, OK, Greensburg, PA, Pine Bluff, WI, and Leesville, SC. During most of that time, Jack was a printing press operator for about 47 years and achieved the coveted "Master Printer" certification. An expert in his trade, he was hand-picked at American Printing Company (Madison, WI) to travel to Germany to learn how to operate Germanmade printing presses in Heidelberg and bring that training back to the USA and teach others.

When their boys graduated from school and went off to their adventures. Jack and Annabelle moved to warmer weather in Leesville, SC. They owned and operated a bed and breakfast (The Able House Inn) for 25 years, hosting travelers from around the world for short stays, wedding receptions and other large or small social gatherings. They loved to entertain and travel.

Jack and Annabelle were active members within the Evangelical Lutheran Church and their community. Jack was the Assistant Scout Master and Annabelle was a Den Mom for Boy Scouts of America Pack 465 in Pennsylvania. Jack was known for his superb woodworking skills, setting up HO gauge model train layouts and fixing just about anything.

Jack is happy to be a resident at Ingleside, grateful to the staff who care for him, and enjoys making new friends.
