Residents, Loved Ones, Team Members, and Visitors,

It is with great optimism, and great caution, that Jaybird Senior Living shares changes to its masking policy. We have reached the point in our COVID journey that our regulating organizations and our internal advisory team are able to decrease our virus mitigation precautions based on community transmission levels being less than “high”. Going forward, masking will not be a mandatory requirement for community staff and visitors. However, when transmission levels climb to a point where there is increased risk, a temporary masking requirement will be instated to mitigate said risk. This high transmission rate is determined by the CDC and will be communicated to you by the Community. Healthcare settings are required to use the transmission levels to implement interventions earlier to better protect vulnerable individuals. The community transmission metric is different than the COVID-19 Community level metric used for non- healthcare settings. If you prefer to wear a mask and this precaution provides peace of mind, please feel free to do so. Our communities will continue to provide complimentary masks for staff and visitors. We continue to ask everyone to adhere to basic principals of infection control, which include social distancing, hand hygiene and staying home if you are ill. Everyone will still need to self-screen for COVID-19 symptoms upon entry to a community. While this is a very exciting announcement we are all looking forward to, we do ask for your patience and understanding as we navigate the future and fluctuating transmission rates. We deeply appreciate your compliance with the measures we’ve put in place to keep our communities safe and healthy for all who live at, work in, and visit them.

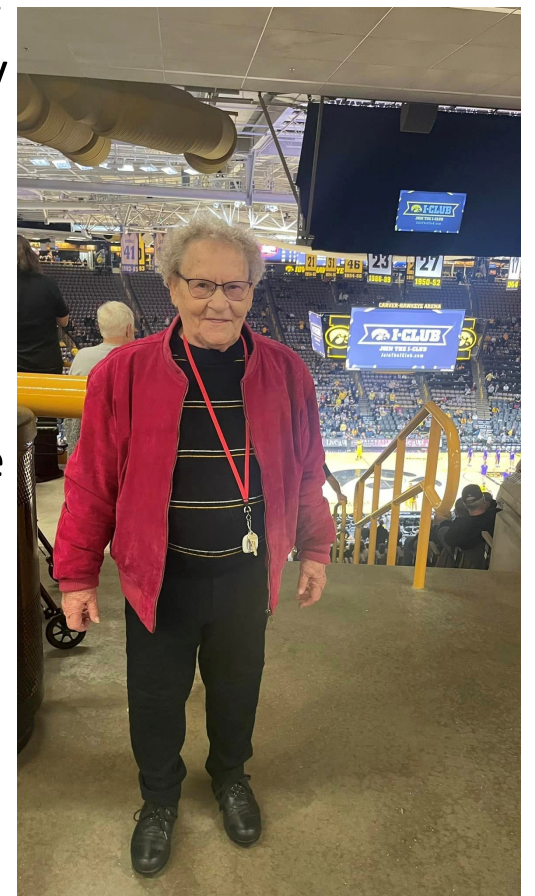
