ART REVEALS W/ARTISAN MIND

This is a wonderful opportunity for the residents to look at artwork from around the world and share stories and share about their lives and things they have done and places they have traveled to.

The discussion supported the residents' emotional well-being and encouraged socialization as they discussed their admiration of the arts and theater. Many residents, including George, Linda and Mary all exclaimed how beautiful they found the photographs of Paris architecture to be and it gave Mary the opportunity to share her experiences traveling in Europe. She shared that she had traveled with a group tour and how much she enjoyed learning from the other people in the group who had insights into the meaning of the art. As we discussed this painting by Manet, which features a young girl watching the trains go by, George and AI both shared their love of trains as a child. George said he played with them a lot as a child and AI described how much he "loved the mechanics" of trains and felt "fascinated" when he saw them.





This painting by Degas began a rich discussion about the dedication it takes to excel in the fine arts. Many of the residents were surprised to learn that Jackie used to be a professional ballerina and she shared her experience by saying, "It takes a lot of work, but it's worth it because it's something you've always wanted to do." Gerry described how each of the orchestra musicians are "busy playing, everyone has something in their hand or mouth and are focused the whole time," to which Linda added, "They have to be!" Dorothy shared that she has been to both the opera and the ballet and enjoyed the "pretty dancing." She said there's no better form of dancing than ballet when you get to see "someone who really knows what they're doing." Gerry admired all of the work and skill she saw in the paintings and shared that she used to enjoy painting landscapes from photographs, adding that "it's hard to make it look real" but that she enjoys the challenge of making art because it "gets your mind off of things."
