- 4. Back in 1776, when the Declaration of Independence was signed, 2.5 million people lived in the U.S. Now in 2023, over 330 million people live in the U.S.
- The now American-celebrated song, Yankee Doodle, was originally written by officers of the British army to make fun of the backwoods Americans.
- 6. Three United Stated presidents died on the Fourth of July: John Adams, Thomas Jefferson and James Monroe.
- 7. July 4th is also celebrated in the Philippines, because in 1946, the country was recognized as an independent nation.
- 8. In one year, \$600 million is spent on fireworks in the U.S. alone.
