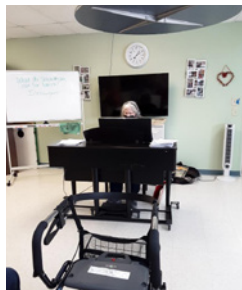
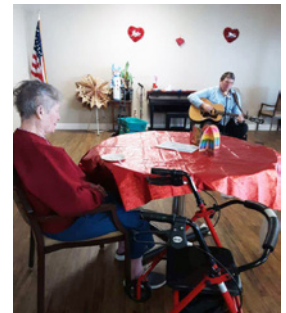
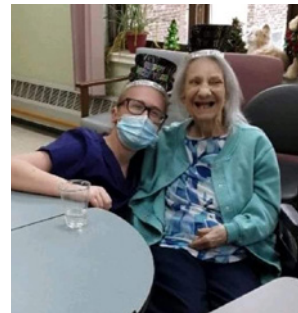
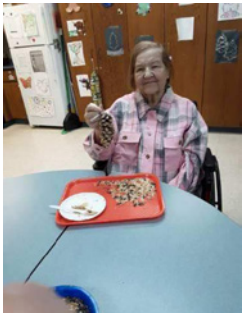


Welcome our new Assistant Administrator, Ashley Miller!

Resident of the Month: Rayne H.

I was born on September 5, 1985, in Yucca Valley, California, in the Mohave Desert. My parents were Diane and Hans Hemminger. Unfortunately, my birth father died when I was a baby. When I was six years old, I developed a brain tumor that was growing aggressively and required a specialized surgery. We were told that my best chance for treatment was at the Children's Hospital in Denver, Colorado. My mom and I drove to Denver where the cancerous tumor was removed, and I received radiation treatment and chemotherapy for the next 3 years.

We continued to live in Olathe, Colorado, on the western slopes of the Rocky Mountains. My mom was a nurse and did not feel comfortable leaving me with a babysitter, so most days I would go with her to work and got to know her coworkers very well. I volunteered in nursing homes to help with whatever was needed for the next 10 years.

While in Olathe, mom met Larry Sewell, and he soon became my stepfather. He was a wonderful addition to our family. He also had a son and four sisters whom I became very close with, although they lived in Madison, Wisconsin. For a while, we were a very happy family, and I was able to go to school and even run and play with other kids. In high school I most enjoyed choir and my history classes. I did well and graduated in 2004 from Olathe High School. Unfortunately, during my high school years, I was diagnosed with Epilepsy, which restricted my activities. The medical professionals assumed the epilepsy was brought on by my previous radiation treatments.

My stepfather became very ill, requiring a great deal of my mom's attention. My mom decided that we should move to Madison, Wisconsin so his sisters and his son could help with his care. He passed away in 2022. By this time, I was living in a group home and enjoyed the independence this offered. I have always been a very independent person. Even

though I have physical limitations, this did not stop me from living the best life possible.

My mom and I have always made our Christian faith an important part of our lives. You may notice the religious displays in my room and hear me speak about my faith. We are members of Good News Lutheran Church in Mount Horeb and attend their services every Sunday that we can. Even though my eyesight no longer allows me to read the bible, I have memorized many of the scriptures.

Last March I experienced a sensation of tingling throughout my body and was taken to the University of Wisconsin Hospital in Madison. It turned out that I had an acute medical attack that caused me to lose the ability to speak, stand or walk. After my hospital stay, I needed extensive rehabilitation during which I had to relearn to do all my basic functions. The doctors could not figure out exactly what happened, so I just refer to it as my "history of mystery".

Following rehabilitation, my mom and I agreed that it was not safe for me to return to the group home. So, I came to Ingleside Communities. Here I receive the care I need in a safe and pleasant environment. I really enjoy the activities here and the food is excellent. I enjoy listening to music in the Harmony Room and doing the craft projects where I can put things together.

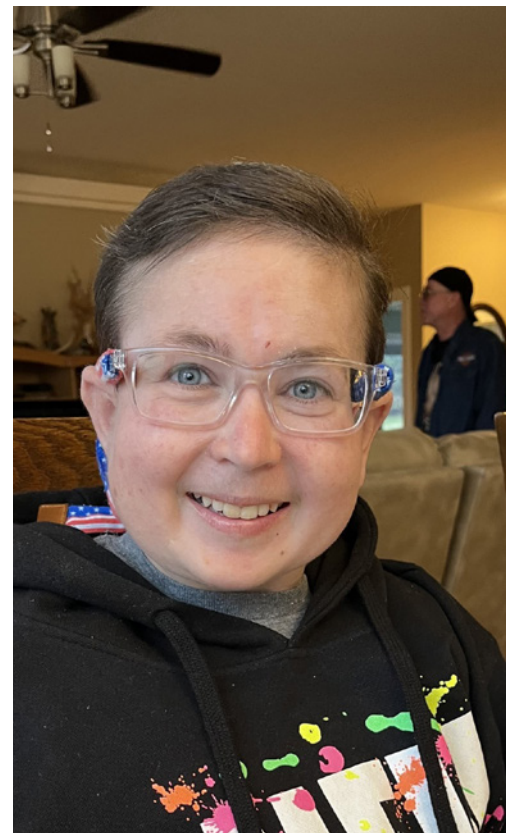
Some might say that I "pick on the employees", but really, I just enjoy teasing them. My mom works at Ingleside, so I can see her often and I have become friends with the staff through her. My therapist, Kyla, has become a good friend and the Administrator for Ingleside, Brynna, is someone we have known from a different workplace.

My mom and I are adventurous and enjoy traveling. In the past we have gone to Washington D.C. and New York City. Recently we spent a few days in Lake

While it is difficult for me to read now because of my eyesight, I do enjoy watching movies, especially Hallmark movies. I have numerous DVDs to choose from every evening before bedtime. As you can tell, I am a strong person and do not let my illness hold me back. I enjoy helping and encouraging others, no matter what they are going through.

I have many wonderful days, but when I have bad days, I just talk with God. He knows my problems and what I need to overcome them if I just pray to Him. I remember fondly the days when I could run and play, but I still move around Ingleside in my wheelchair with that same spirit of adventure and positive attitude about my life and the people around me.
