Tree of the Month - Ash

Ash is the common name for Fraxinus trees, which are part of the olive and lilac family. These trees (and the leaves they drop) benefit the soil by raising the pH and making more nutrients available in the ground. Ash trees grow in fertile, moist soil across Europe, Africa, Asia, and North America, in climates as diverse as those of Nova Scotia, Florida, Texas, and Minnesota. They can be identified by their compound leaves, which have five to nine leaflets each. Additionally, ash tree leaflets, branches, and buds always grow opposite one another. Ash wood has a



variety of uses, including for furniture, baseball bats, hockey sticks, and oars. It is not suitable for exterior building projects, as it becomes perishable when exposed to the elements or it is in contact with the ground. In Norse mythology, the ash tree is considered sacred and symbolizes magic, life, strength, wisdom, healing, and balance.

Flower - Daffodil



The cheerful daffodil is associated with spring because it's one of the first flowers to bloom. *Daffodil* is the common name

for all members of the genus *narcissus*. In the language of flowers, daffodils symbolize chivalry, respect, modesty, and faithfulness. It is the birth flower for March and represents new beginnings. Most daffodils are yellow, but varieties include pink, lime green, and a mix of yellow and white. They often grow in large clusters, covering lawns and entire hillsides.

Birthstone – Aquamarine



The birthstone for March is the aquamarine. This gorgeous gemstone gets its name from the Latin term *aqua marina*, meaning "sea water." It's an apt name

considering the aquamarine's sparkling turquoise color, which ranges from pale to medium blue. Blue aquamarines are the rarest and most valuable. The green stones are sometimes changed to blue by heating them in an electric furnace at 842°F (450°C). Most aquamarines are found in Brazil.
