GAIT BELT POLICY

POLICY:

It is the policy of this facility that residents who need physical assistance with ambulation and transfers to and from any surface; that gait belts will be used to maintain optimal balance. This includes transfers from bed, any type of chair, commode, toilet, etc.

PURPOSE:

To aid in resident ambulation and transfers and to promote optimal balance and safety.

PLACEMENT:

Gait belts should be placed at midline with Velcro, or snap closure in front. Adjust belt accordingly for a snug but not constricting fit. Be sure you check by sliding your flat palm between the gait belt and resident. Use on outside of clothing.

PROCEDURE:

- 1. Explain to resident clearly what you are going to do. Tell them the safety belt will protect them and you. It protects them from losing their balance.
- 2. Apply the gait belt before standing or transferring the resident.
- 3. Grasp the gait belt during transfer. During ambulation use one hand to secure/grasp the gait belt and the other hand should be placed on residents hand or forearm to support and guide the resident.
- 4. Remove the gait belt after ambulation or transfer.

CONTRAINDICATIONS:

Do not use on a resident who has had recent abdominal surgery or has a PEG tube. Apply cautiously with a colostomy resident or those with a superpubic catheter.
